





My Dear Friends in Christ,

When I was discerning a call to priesthood, I felt a little like



"Come, and you will see" (Jn 1:39). With these simple, yet profound, words, Jesus makes the invitation to two of John's disciples (Andrew and his brother Simon (Peter)). This is after John declares Jesus to be "the Lamb of God" (Jn 1:36), the first time that Jesus is called by that title. It is an important moment of recognition, for Jesus will indeed be the "sacrificial lamb" for His followers – including you and me. We can look at this invitation as one meant for us, as well. Jesus invites to stay with Him, to abide with Him. Be careful, though, for when we accept this invitation our lives will change radically, as they did for Andrew and Simon Peter (as well as the other Apostles).

This invitation to come and follow Jesus is a wholly different way of living. It is not how the world lives, for the world lives in temporality, in a finite space; it may seem infinite (and is, in many ways), but it will pass away and be no more one day. The world in which Jesus calls us to live is rooted in the Eternal Kingdom, even as it has elements at work in this world. Jesus reminds His listener that "the Kingdom of God is at hand" (Mt 3:2) and "the Kingdom of God is in your midst" (Lk 17:21). He is telling us this so that we may be prepared to join Him in the Eternal Kingdom, for if we wait until the Second Coming from Jesus' arrival it will be too late. We must prepare here and now for Jesus' arrival again (at the end of time), for it will be a "one-time offer" – and won't be made again.

May we take the opportunity today – here and now – to heed the invitation made by Jesus to "come and...see" (Jn 1:39) where He is staying. Hopefully, we won't have to go any further than our own hearts to see this residence. May we know Jesus' abiding peace and presence, and may we share it with all whom we meet.

Christ Is Anything but Ordinary

We're about to dive headlong into week two of Ordinary Time, and we need to admit, after the hustle and bustle of the holidays, things are indeed looking more ... ordinary, at least in our spiritual lives.

The transcendent highs of the Christmas season are flatlining a bit and the vivid imagery of the Nativity scene has faded. The solemn anticipation of the Advent season is by now a distant memory.

Are you bored yet?

Here's a secret: I think that Ordinary Time can actually be quite extraordinary, if we're really living out our baptismal call.

In today's Gospel, Jesus point-blank asks Andrew, who is following him after hearing John the Baptist's testimony: "What are you looking for?" He's asking us the same question.

What are you looking for? Why are you following me? Is it for the Christmas cookies and the Advent carols? Is it for the King's Cake on the Epiphany? Is it for the feeling we get on Christmas when we just know God has done a wondrous thing?

None of those things are bad, but they are not what Andrew was looking for, and they were not what Christ promised him when he said, "Come, and you will see." Andrew was looking for the Messiah — the One who makes even Ordinary Time extraordinary. The One who can sanctify the longest and dullest of to-do lists, on the longest and dullest of days. The One whose peace can reign in our homes on January 25, not just December 25.

Remember what you are looking for. Come, and you will see.



News from the Pilot

Washington D.C., Jan 4, 2021 CNA.- The word "amen" is not a gendered word and the term "a-women" is entirely made up, a professor of theology who specializes in Hebrew told CNA, after a prayer in the U.S. Congress used the fake word.

On Sunday, January 3, Rep. Emanuel Cleaver (D-MO) led the opening prayer for the U.S. House of Representatives.

Cleaver, an ordained Methodist pastor who served for 37 years as the senior pastor of St. James United Methodist Church in Kansas City, Missouri, ended his prayer asking for peace in the legislative chamber, "in the name of the monotheistic God, Brahma, and God known by many names by many different faiths. Amen and a-women."

"Brahma" is the Hindu creator deity. There are members of the legislature who belong to Christian, Jewish, Hindu, Buddhist, and Unitarian Universalist faiths.

While the word "amen" ends in "men," like "repairmen" or "handymen," it is not in reference to a gender, Dr. John Bergsma of the Franciscan University of Steubenville said to CNA on Monday. Bergsma has taught four undergraduate courses on Hebrew, as well as a summer intensive on the language.

"'Amen' is a Hebrew word whose root meaning is 'truth," Bergsma explained to CNA. "Already in ancient times, the Israelites used the term 'amen' in solemn ceremonies to express consent to the truth of what was said, meaning, 'it is true' or 'so be it,' depending on context."

In Hebrew, said Bergsma, the word for man is 'adam' or 'ish,' and is unrelated to the word "amen."

"In fact, the Hebrew pronunciation is 'ah-MAIN,' rhyming with 'train,' and doesn't sound like 'men,'" he said. "It is a verbal form, not a noun."

The use of "amen" in Christian liturgical and prayerful context, said Bergsma, "expresses complete consent and faith in what is being said or done, as when we approach the Eucharist and say 'amen' to the minister's statement, 'The Body of Christ'."

"At the end of prayer, 'amen" expresses our solemn consent to what has been said in prayer, affirming that we have been truthful and expressing faith in God's truthfulness and trustworthiness," he said.

As for Cleaver's use of "a-women" in Sunday's prayer?

"'A-women' is wordplay for comical or political effect in English," said Bergsma. "Strictly speaking, it is a nonsensical mashup of syllables from different languages."



"The beginning of the Prayer of St. Francis is familiar to most of us: "Lord, make me an instrument of your peace". And it is peace we need in our nation today, united by the common good of our people. The violence witnessed in our nation's capital yesterday serves only to inflame our divisions and pit citizen against citizen at a time we need to be united. We reject all forms of violence including the acts of those who stormed our Capitol. We pray for those who lost their lives and for their loved ones and for the injured. We live in a divided nation and the challenges our nation faces are significant.
