

#### **MASSES FOR THE WEEK**



My Dear Friends in Christ,

Back in high school, I was asked by my pastor if I had ever considered a vocation to the priesthood. I can remember distinctly the reaction I had to that inquiry: I laughed in his face! There was no disrespect intended, for I was sure that he was joking; when he said that he wasn't I was, to say the least, contrite if not downright remorseful. This encounter was then followed by two other (seemingly, at the moment) unrelated conversations. When the third conversation occurred surrounding this same topic I was, indeed, intrigued. Was God actually calling *me* to the priesthood? Did I dare say yes? When I did, eventually, say yes, my whole world changed. I realized that God was, indeed, calling me to become a "fisher of men" (Mk 1:17).

In today's gospel, the response of the first followers of Jesus was far more immediate and sure. They left everything they had and followed Jesus, which must have taken extraordinary faith and courage. To leave everything you know, everything that holds you secure is an amazing "leap of faith". This is what God is calling us to do, to respond to our baptismal call by following Him. Yes, it does take an incredible amount of faith to do this, but when we do the results can be life-changing. We may not be called to leave everything we know, but that's not really the point of today's gospel. In its wider context, the gospel passage today is calling us to look within our own circles of friends, our own families, to see who needs to be "reeled in". There are many of our own who are "adrift" who are looking for "safe harbor", and we can be the one who brings them "safely to shore".

We can't be sure of what was going through the minds of those first disciples, but we know that there was something alluring about Jesus' call to them. It made them give up everything they knew, everything that held them secure, to follow Him. Is God calling us to something, something beyond ourselves? Is God calling us, by virtue of our baptismal call, to be disciples, to be (in paraphrasing the gospel) "fishers of people"? It could very well be that God is calling us and, for whatever reason – it could be apathy, fear or doubt – we are not responding as fully as we could/should be. Let us have the same trust the first disciples did. Let us attune our hearts to hear the call of Jesus so that others may come to know what we have come to know: that Jesus has come into the world to follow Him, now and into the Kingdom.

#### MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

In today's first reading, we have God speaking to Jonah, calling him to go to the city of Nineveh with a message of "convert, or else!" It was not, as we used to say in the seminary, a "warm and fuzzy" message. It was a call for the people of Nineveh to convert or risk the loss of their lives. Jonah proceeded to go through the city with this call to conversion...and it worked! The city saw the error of their ways and turned back to God. When we think of St. Francis, we might think of his preaching as "warm and fuzzy", especially since he did things like preach to the birds. Of course, the reason he turned to the birds with his message was because the people turned their hearts away from God and from St. Francis' preaching so he had no alternative but to change his audience

When you ask people, "What was Saint Francis' preaching style like?" they draw from a modern, sentimental view of the man that glosses over this individual who had an amazing conversion, who rebuked his former sinful way of life to radically follow the gospel. And he never forgot that. Thomas Celano, who was the individual who wrote the first biography about Saint Francis had this to say about St. Francis' preaching: "His words were neither hollow, nor ridiculous, but filled with the power of the Holy Spirit, penetrating the marrow of the heart so that listeners were turned to great amazement." (Celano, "First Life of Francis"). This guy didn't preach light and fluffy stuff; he penetrated to people's very hearts with his insights. And now, how did he do that? Well, in Francis' time, the training at universities for homiletics, or how to give homilies, it stressed that you want to be scholarly, you want to be precise, but it just wasn't very pastoral. So, the sermons that people gave were really dry or really harsh. They just didn't really connect well with people. So, the same thing happened with Saint Francis in that he never went to a university to get this kind of homiletic training. Instead of his preaching being academic, however, his preaching came from his own conversion experience. It was deeply personal. And the way that he would preach, it was energetic, he would sing, he would dance, he would weep. He was filled with energy and vibrancy when he preached to people.

In his own way, St. Francis won souls for Christ. He did so in an energetic, pastoral, and personal way. In reaching the people, he worked at "penetrating the marrow of the heart" (ibid.). May we be touched to the heart by the person of Jesus Christ, and may we come to know Him with our whole heart, soul, strength, and mind.

A Good Time for Fulfillment By Colleen Jurkiewicz Dorman

There are some things that always come at the worst time. I've never gotten a telemarketing call and thought, "This is a really convenient moment for me to listen to a sales pitch." I've never seen the compulsory software update notice flash on my computer screen when I *didn't* have a deadline I was struggling to meet. My kids never come down with the flu unless it's the weekend and the line at Urgent Care is stretching out the door.

And I never, ever feel the calm, persistent shoulder-tap of the Holy Spirit without thinking, "Now? Now is not a good time. Can you try again when I'm..."

But then I stop and think: when I am what? When I am stronger? When I am happier? When I am smarter? When I am a different person?

When God calls us, He calls the person He sees in front of Him. "Come on," He says, and He doesn't mean "When you're finished" or "When it's convenient" or "Think about it." He means now. This moment.

This is what Paul is saying when he writes that "the world in its present form is passing away." He is saying that your plans mean nothing, the kingdom of God is at hand. Abandon your nets, let your catch escape into the sea. You're not who you thought you were, and you don't need what you thought you needed.

Your sins do not define you. Your fears are not fate. Your inclinations do not govern you. Your life can be changed. We live in the time of fulfillment, and fulfillment is coming for you — ready or not.




