



MASSES FOR THE WEEK

My Dear Friends in Christ,

I was speaking to some folks the other day about the various churches in which I've celebrated Mass. The one thing that stands



out for me in each of these buildings is the Cross; it tends to stand out as the most prominent feature in most churches. I've seen all different styles, types and interpretations, but what tends to "link" them is the power to move one's heart towards union with Christ. One of the most beautiful crosses I've seen in recent memory is the Franciscan cross found in the Basilica de Santa Croce (Church of the Holy Cross) in Florence, said to have been founded by St. Francis of Assisi himself. The cross present in this church was such a powerful manifestation of Christ that it literally brought me to tears.

The Cross of Christ stands before us as a stark reminder not only of the sacrifice of Christ, but the sacrifice which we (as followers of Jesus) are called to make. It also brings to mind the love we are called to have for our brothers and sisters in Christ. It is in the name of Jesus that we do, as Christians, what we do. It is His love - a selfless, emptying (or "kenotic", as the Greeks would say) love - which we bring into the world. This is not unique to Christians, for there are many who do not share in the Christian faith who give of themselves beyond measure without expectation of recompense. What makes Christian love unique is that it is not mere altruism (giving for the sake of giving, giving because it "feels good"); Christian love is what it is because of the source and end result of that love - Jesus and His Kingdom. It is a love which the world cannot or will not understand, because there is (seemingly) nothing in it for the giver. There's no "what's in it for me" or "looking out for #1" because what's "in it for us" is intangible and the "#1" for whom we're looking out is Jesus!

The gospel passage from today contains what is, arguably, the most famous line in scripture: "For God so loved the world, that He gave us His only Son so that everyone who believes in Him might not perish but might have eternal life" (Jn 3:16). It is so well known due not only to being seen at sporting events throughout the world, but also because it points to the Cross, which is a "stumbling block" for some but which is the vehicle of salvation for so many who believe in the sacrifice of Jesus. It is we who bring this scriptural passage into the world for whom this message is meant. It is not for us alone, however - it is meant for all who "have ears to hear", and are open to the message. May we have the courage to not only hear, but listen, that Jesus is calling us to conversion, such that when Jesus is lifted high on the Cross that we are with Him. May we know His transforming love, and share it with all whom we meet!

MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

The Cross stands for us as one of the most powerful symbols of our relationship with Christ. It was at the Cross that Jesus gave Mary, his Blessed Mother, over to the care of John (the Beloved Disciple) and John over to the maternal love of Mary. It was at the Cross at San Damiano that St. Francis heard the words that would change his life and, for many, the world. It was at the Church of San Damiano that St. Francis was told by the Lord "rebuild my Church, for it is falling down". St. Francis took these words literally, at first, and began to rebuild the church stone by stone. It was only through further discernment that Our Lord was telling St. Francis to "rebuild" in the spiritual sense. St. Francis was to reform the Church, or at least his little corner of it.

When St. Francis heard these words of the Lord at the foot of the Cross at San Damiano, his "new life" was set in motion and he would go on to found the Franciscan Order as well as the Poor Clares, the second "branch" of the Franciscan "tree". His own personal life would also change after that encounter with the Lord at the foot of the San Damiano Cross, his own personal "Calvary". Secular Franciscans, for their part, join in this "cross bearing" by wearing the Tau Cross, which is the "habit" of the Secular Franciscan Order. The Tau was created by St. Francis, who modeled it after the letter "T" ("Tau", in the Greek alphabet), as it most closely resembled the Cross of Christ. I wear one (as do my fellow Secular Franciscans) to remind us to "live like Francis", who strove to "live like Jesus". It is a daily reminder, when it is donned, to live simply, humbly, but profoundly in our commitment to Christ and His Gospel.

The gospel today reminds us of how Jesus was "lifted up" (John 3:14) on the Cross and how we are called to "lift up" Jesus by putting Him first and making Him present in all we do. The gospel further reminds us that we are to be people of the light, letting Christ's light shine through us into a darkened and broken world. St. Francis did this by bringing God's peace, mercy, and love into the world by his preaching, teaching, and living simply. May we be a people of the light as well, bringing Christ's light into our everyday encounters.
