




MASSES FOR THE WEEK

My Dear Friends in Christ,

Jesus once noted, regarding the law, that He had come to "fulfill"



In today's gospel passage, some Greeks wish to meet Jesus. This encounter is brought about in a linear fashion, moving from Phillip, to Andrew, to Phillip AND Andrew, and finally to Jesus. When all arrive and hear from Jesus, He talks about the sacrifice He must make for this "fulfillment" to take place. Jesus uses the analogy of a seed which must die so that life might be brought forth. Analogously, it is only in Jesus' death that we can have life; it is the death of Jesus that will bring about Eternal Life for us. This is to take place so that the covenant between God and the People of God can be realized.

God alludes to this covenant when Jeremiah brings the message of God to the people. Unlike the covenants of old, this "new covenant" will be unbroken because it will not be written in stone (like the Ten Commandments) but on our hearts. It is when this "new covenant" is written that we will be in "full communion" with God. Jesus will bring this about in His life, death, and resurrection. When we enter into Holy Week (in just about a week's time!) we make a journey with Jesus, who will then fulfill all that was written about Him.

We are called to enter into this "new covenant" with God, through Jesus, by giving our lives in service to God and to our brothers and sisters. May we, in concluding our Lenten observances, continue to give our hearts to God so that He may write His Law upon them. May we come to know Jesus, have the courage to walk with Him, and seek to fulfill all that God has called us to do. May we take this Law, written on our hearts, and apply it to all that we do, say and are. May we share this Law, this Law of Love, with all whom we meet.



MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

Today, along with the Fifth Sunday of Lent, we celebrate (along with the rest of the world) St. Patrick's Day. Often times, when we think of the saints, we tend to make them into otherworldly creatures who have nothing in common with us. In the case of St. Patrick, we tend to think of the "legend" of St. Patrick driving the snakes out of Ireland; the only problem with that is that Ireland, being an island, doesn't have any snakes! That legend notwithstanding, St. Patrick did much to bring Christianity to the people of Ireland and is revered as a great man of faith – not only in Ireland, but throughout the world!

When we think of St. Francis, we tend to think of the saint who preached to animals and spoke of peace. We tend to forget that St. Francis, like St. Patrick, was a good and faithful churchman who transmitted the faith by teaching the truths of the faith. He did so by making it accessible and applicable to everyday life, and he did that taking the otherworldly and making it real, helping the follower of St. Francis incorporate the truths of the faith into one's day-to-day experiences. St. Francis associated with all, and he never wavered in his commitment to Christ. From the moment he knelt before the Cross at San Damiano, St. Francis' life was the epitome of discipleship and he strove to live like Christ each and every day.

As we move ever closer to the end of our Lenten journey, let us take stock of how we have done to grow closer to Christ. Let us examine our relationship with Christ and see how it is that we have grown. Like St. Francis, let us be unafraid to "kiss the leper" and embrace the challenging moments of our life that we have still yet to confront. Let us be unapologetically united to Christ by living like Him. Let us, as Francis did, seek to make our relationship with Christ as deep as humanly possible. May this upcoming Holy Week give us the opportunity to unite ourselves to Christ to the same extent and degree that St. Francis did.

CREMATION Guidelines for Cremation according the Archdiocese of Boston.

While the Church recommends that the pious custom of burying the bodies of the dead be observed, cremation is permitted as long as it has not been chosen for reasons contrary to Catholic teaching (Canon 1176.3 Catechism of the Catholic Church, #2301).

Given the increased practice of cremation in recent years, special care must be given to communicate the proper disposition of the remains in keeping with Christian tradition and respect for the body.

- 1. It is preferred that the Funeral Mass or the Funeral Liturgy outside Mass be celebrated in the presence of the body of the deceased prior to its cremation. (OCF Appendix Cremation #411-438)
- 2. The significance of having the body of the deceased present for the funeral liturgy is indicated throughout the Mass texts and ritual actions. Therefore, when arrangements involving cremation are being made, the parish priest is to recommend that: a) following a wake, or a time of visitation, the Funeral Mass be celebrated in the presence of the body of the deceased person, and that following the Funeral Mass, the body of the deceased be cremated; b) the Funeral Mass conclude with the final commendation in the church; c) at an appropriate time, usually some days later, the family gather at the cemetery for the burial of the cremated remains. The Rite of Committal takes place at this time with the inclusion of the proper prayers for the committal of ashes (OCF #406.3).
- 3. If cremation has already taken place before the Funeral Mass, the pastor may permit the celebration of the Funeral Mass in the presence of the cremated remains of the deceased person.
- 4. Special circumstances occur, such as health concerns or out-of-state or overseas transport which prompt families to arrange for cremation before making funeral arrangements. If RCAB | Policy and Instruction on Ecclesiastical Funeral Rites 15 cremation has taken place, the parish priest is to recommend: a) gathering with family and friends for prayer and remembrance of the deceased; b) celebration of a Funeral Mass; c) gathering with family and friends for the interment of cremated remains at the cemetery in the Rite of Committal.
- 5. Cremated remains should be treated with the same respect given to the remains of a human body, and should be buried or entombed. It is not permitted to scatter the ashes of the faithful departed in the air, on land, at sea or in some other way, nor may they be preserved in mementos, pieces of jewelry or other objects.
