There is an old spiritual titled "What a Friend We Have in Jesus". Could you imagine being a



friend of Jesus? I'm not talking about a disciple, apostle or follower of Jesus – we're all called to be that. I'm talking about a friend – some with whom you "hang out", have over to dinner, someone with whom you play golf or tennis. This is the type of relationship which Martha, Mary and Lazarus had with Jesus. Think back to the gospel passage (Lk 10:38-42) where Martha was busy preparing to host Jesus and Mary just sat there (or seemed to, to the untrained eye), ending with Martha being told that Mary had taken the "better part, and it shall not be taken from her" (Lk 10:42). This was a moment when Jesus showed He was a friend of Martha, Mary and Lazarus. Their friendship was evidenced by the honesty of their words, something friends aren't afraid to do.

The story of the "raising of Lazarus" is one of friendship, both human and spiritual. Jesus gets word that Lazarus is ill. One would think that Jesus, a friend of the trio, would rush right over (or perhaps send one of His disciples in His name). Yet Jesus waits for two days before departing from where He was. This may seem strange, but Jesus assures those around Him that "this illness is not to end in death, but is for the glory of God…" (Jn 11:4). Jesus has already formulated a plan in His mind; He knows exactly what He is going to do, for He knows exactly who He is. Jesus knows He has power over life and death, so He knows that even if Lazarus experiences an earthly death that this particular episode will not end in death.

There is another reality at work here as well. Jesus knows that He has power over life and death because, as He proclaims to Martha, He is "the resurrection and the life" (Jn 11:25). It is in this "vein" that Jesus raises Lazarus from the dead. Jesus isn't concerned about the crowds and their wailing; He isn't concerned about the stench emanating from the tomb; He isn't even concerned about Lazarus being dead. Jesus knows who He is, what He is about and what He is doing at all times. This is a powerful lesson for us. While we don't have power over life and death, we have power (in the form of "free will") to decide how we are to live in this life, and thus how we are to spend Eternal Life. God wants us to be with Him in the Kingdom, sharing Eternal Life, but the choice is ours. We choose God by how we choose to live our lives, either in union with God or with the world. Whatever choices we make, the choice is ours. Let us choose wisely and well, so that we may spend Eternal Life in the Kingdom with God and all the saints in the Heavenly Kingdom.

MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

When one looks at the life of Jesus, miracle stories abound during His ministry. Today's gospel shows one of those miracles, the raising (from the dead) of Lazarus. Jesus loved Lazarus, so a case could be made that Jesus raised him from the dead solely because of His love for him. The love Jesus had for Lazarus was certainly evident, but it wasn't the only reason for this miracle. Jesus also raised Lazarus to show forth the power of God. When looking at the life of St. Francis, there were several instances of the miraculous happening during his ministry. Here are but a few of these miraculous happenings:

> A paralyzed man lived in the city of Nardi. One day, he learned of the arrival of Francis in this city to preach, appealed to the diocesan bishop's plea to send the poor man of Assisi. After Francis' acceptance of this invitation he arrived at the man's home and, with a simple sign of the cross, healed the paralytic.

A woman (also from the city of Nardi) regained her sight when Francis made the sign of the cross.

A woman with hands clenched so as not to use them heard about the coming of the Holy Father Francis to her city urged him to regain use of her hands. Francis heard her prayer healed her.

St. Francis had pity for a Friar hit by epilepsy; Francis went to him and, after having blessed him, healed him.

A woman possessed lived in in the City of Castello; Francis, passing there, drove out the demon and freed the woman from harm.

These are but a few healings during the life of Francis. During the process of his canonization, many others came forward and spoke of Francis' intercession in healings that took place. These intercessions were part of the testimony needed to "prove" the miraculous nature of Francis' life. May we look to Francis for his intercession as we make our way through our Lenten journey and to the "ultimate healing" of the Resurrection.
