



My Dear Friends in Christ,

Poet and novelist Vanna Bonta was once quoted as saying that she considers herself "more exportant than important". Forgiving her the act of making up a word, her point is well taken, especially in light of today's readings. The readings for this weekend are all about service, discipleship and the act of putting oneself second to the needs of others.

In the first reading, taken from the Acts of the Apostles, we recall the institution of the diaconate. As our own Deacons Joe and Brendan can tell you, the deaconate is a ministry of service. It was "created" because there were members of the community (widows) whose basic human needs were not being met. This did not sit well with the Hellenists who were, to say the least, skeptical of this "New Way" (as Christianity was first called). In calling together the seven mentioned in today's reading, the basic needs of service were met while the prayer of the others could be undertaken. This is not to say that prayer was more important than service; in fact, quite the opposite. The ministry of the deaconate was established because service to the community was vitally important to its well-being. In this way, Jesus' command to care for the "least" among us would be met.

In our second reading, we see how our lives of discipleship rest on the "cornerstone" (1 Pt 2:6) who is Christ. This "living stone, rejected by human beings but chosen and precious in the sight of God" (1 Pt 2:4), is the "template" by which we are to model our lives. We all belong to the "priesthood of the baptized", and as such are called to model our lives after the "great High Priest" who is Christ. His priesthood was one of service, and ours must be as well. If we are to follow in the footsteps of Jesus, we must put our needs, wants and desires second to those of the community.

In our gospel passage, we hear of how the works that we do mirror our faith in God, It is not that we can ever "earn" our way into heaven, but the works we do show our faith in the One who instills in us the will to respond to God's call to serve our brothers and sisters. This weekend, several of our youngsters received Jesus in Eucharist this weekend for the very first time! My prayer for them is that they listen to Jesus speaking to their heart by serving His Church in whatever way they can, large or small!

May we all hear and respond to God's call to serve His people. May we know that this call is the fulfillment of our baptismal call to put our needs second to that of our brothers and sisters. May we know the way to the Father by following Christ in all that we say, do and are by seeing the needs of our brothers and sisters, responding to those needs and always striving for the greater glory of God!

#### MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY


In today's gospel, Jesus speaks one of those "hard truths" that people don't necessarily associate with Him: "Jesus said to him, I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." (John 14:6). It is in this challenging declaration that Jesus sets a course to the Kingdom – through Him. Jesus wasn't afraid to "speak the truth in love", and neither was St. Francis.

St. Francis was certainly compassionate, seeing Christ in all things – people, nature, even the leper. But he wasn't afraid to challenge people, even his own Franciscan brothers, when they strayed from the truth. He was not afraid to even challenge those within his own Church. His life and message were uncompromising and simple: greed causes suffering for both the victims and the perpetrators. St Francis's views about the perpetrators are relevant as bankers award themselves enormous undeserved bonuses, while others suffer. The indifference of the greedy and their hatred of the poor hurt the rich, too: St Francis believed living with that sort of attitude was morally, socially and spiritually destructive. St Francis gave no unwarranted deference to people in high places, and when he walked to Rome and finally saw what the Vatican was like, he exploded. He publicly criticized the greed, wealth, power, venality, worldliness, corruption and emptiness of it all. Pope Innocent III could hardly believe his ears. Nobody had ever spoken to him like that, and here was this poor "nobody" telling him that the church was against Christ. St Francis was jailed for this outburst, but in the end the pope let him go.

St Francis offers a vision of a different world, where we share more equally the abundant wealth of goods and life itself as we focus on the right relations to the earth and all our fellow creatures. May we live like Jesus, and be unafraid to lead others to the truth. May we be like Francis, and lead others to Christ. May we use what we have for the benefit for all, striving to bring all to Christ.





#### **NEWS**

Question: Are Catholics obligated to attend Mass each Sunday, or receive Communion each Sunday?

The questions about Mass attendance and the reception of Holy Communion are clearly outlined in what are traditionally called the "Precepts" of the Church. These specific teachings are intended to stand alongside the Ten Commandments as fundamental practices for Catholics and are outlined in the Code of Canon Law. The obligations related to Mass attendance and receiving Communion are outlined in the first and third precepts, which we find quoted in the Catechism of the Catholic Church (no. 2042):

The first precept ("You shall attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor") requires the faithful to sanctify the day commemorating the Resurrection of the Lord as well as the principal liturgical feasts honoring the mysteries of the Lord, the Blessed Virgin Mary, and the saints; in the first place, by participating in the Eucharistic celebration, in which the Christian community is gathered, and by resting from those works and activities which could impede such a sanctification of these days.

The third precept ("You shall receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season") guarantees as a minimum the reception of the Lord's Body and Blood in connection with the Paschal feasts, the origin and center of the Christian liturgy.

Rather than seeing these as obligations that are simply to be fulfilled out of a sense of duty, Pope Saint John Paul II reminds us of the grace that is made available to us when we gather for Sunday celebrations of the Eucharist: "Sunday is the day which is at the very heart of the Christian life... Time given to Christ is never time lost, but is rather time gained, so that our relationships and indeed our whole life may become more profoundly human" (Dies Domini, no. 7).
