

My Dear Friends in Christ,

There is an old expression that states that one is to “grow where you are planted”. If one were to “Google” this phrase, they would come up with over sixteen *million* entries (16.3, to be exact!)! A quick scan of the topic shows that most of them have to do with gardening, giving the best “tips” on how to get the most out of your plants, fruits, and vegetables; some, however, speak on what Jesus is getting at, that for one to grow and flourish in one’s faith, good “soil” is needed.

Jesus explains the parable effectively enough to His disciples (and to those whose ears are open to hearing what He has to say) that it would be foolish for me to “re-invent the wheel”, as it were and try and “top” Jesus. So, where does one go from here? I think if this parable (or any parable, for that matter) is to have any meaning for us, we have to apply it to the “here and now”. In our modern age, we can think that we know all there is to know about “the Evil One”, as Satan is referred to in this passage. That would be a mistake, and a deadly one at that! The challenge with Satan is that he is always “reinventing” himself to suit the present age. The tricks, ruses and guises that he used back in the time of Jesus are not, of course, the same ones he uses today, for he knows that they wouldn’t work on us. The temptations which Satan uses are, in theory, the same; it is the mode and methods he uses which change. Take the internet, for example. The world-wide web can be an effective tool for communication, teaching and learning. The fact that my bulletin column is available online is proof of that! That same form of transmitting knowledge, however, can be used for less-than-noble purposes – thus the dilemma. Do we *not* use the web? Of course not; for most that would be highly impractical. We would do well to be careful, however, in how we use this tool to its most effective manner. It can be that “good ground” (which bears good fruit), but it can also be that “rocky” or “thorny” soil (which “chokes off” any good which is found in the good seed of faith).

Jesus invites “whoever has ears ought to hear” (Mt 13:9), meaning you and I. May we have open ears, and hearts, to take in the gospel message. May we be that “rich soil” (Mt 13:8), receptive to the Word of God, taking in the “good seed” that is the Word. May we have the courage to share the Good News with all whom we meet!

## JOURNEY TO PEACE: TRUE BLESSEDNESS

### The Way to Peace

We know that God is with us in all things. We know the Kingdom of God is where our hearts and souls are most at home. Yet we still manage to *think* in very earthly ways, to reduce everything to our narrow understanding of life

Like the woman who called out to Jesus, our minds are still tethered to earth, to what we can see with our eyes. But true peace comes from hearing the Word of God, true happiness comes from understanding what God is telling us in Scripture, and true love comes from *living* what we hear and understand.

If we want to quell anxiety, fear, tiredness, or distraction; if we want to heal pain, anger, grief, or distress, then the way to peace is through reading the Word and hearing it with our hearts. God will always give us what we most need when we most need it.

---

**Take a few moments to become aware of God's presence.** Close your eyes and take a few deep breaths, remembering that in this very moment you are under the gaze of God, who knows and loves you totally.

**Bring to mind some obstacle between you and union with God.** It could be something that you're worried or unsure about. It could be a problem, a task, or responsibility. It could be anything.

### A reading from the Word of God:

While he was saying this, a woman in the crowd raised her voice and said to him, "Blessed is the womb that bore you and the breasts that nursed you!" But he said, "Blessed rather are those who hear the word of God and obey it!" (Luke 11:27-30, NRSV).

**Ask yourself:** How is Jesus responding to this woman? How does he show there is more than what's on the surface?

**Notice what arises within you.** It could be a feeling, an image, a word, a memory, anything.

**Slow down and wait** for this feeling, image, or word to become clearer for you. Become fully aware of it and sit with it for a few moments.

Then, in the sanctuary of your baptized soul (which is the temple of the Holy Spirit) **speak to that Divine Spirit**, saying: *O Holy Spirit, beloved of my soul, I adore you. Enlighten me, guide me, strengthen me, console me. Tell me what I should do; give me Your orders. I promise to submit myself to all that you desire of me and to accept all that you permit to happen to me. Let me only know your will.* (Cardinal Mercier's Prayer to the Holy Spirit)

**After a few moments of stillness, return to the obstacle** that was bothering you and see how it may have shifted, even subtly.

**Again, slow down and wait** for an image, word, or feeling to come into awareness that perfectly expresses what is at the core of your present experience.

**Place your feelings and thoughts in a package... and hand it to Jesus.**

## Prayer

*Blessed Lord, grant me the gift of understanding your word and applying it to my life. Widen my vision beyond my own small world to embrace with knowledge and love the worlds of others. Help me, Lord, to always see you at work in my own life and in the lives of others. Bless me with insight, acceptance, and love that is tempered by you who are all things to all people. Help me to understand, blessed Lord. Amen.*

**End your time of prayer** with an Our Father, entrusting all your needs and feelings to God.


