A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

My Dear Friends in Christ,

Anyone who has lived a certain length of time knows that there is evil in the world. Our young people may not know this reality (which is a good thing, for sure), but (sadly)



one day they will come to experience this truth. For centuries theologians, philosophers and scholars have wrestled with the question of evil, its existence and how and why it comes about in the world. I'm not sure they're any closer to figuring it out than they were when they first tackled it!

The reality of the Christian life is that, along with the good in our life, there is evil in the world. God does not cause this evil to occur (contrary to what many in the world may think), but He does allow it to exist. This is known in theological terms as "the permissive will of God", and it basically states that God allows suffering and evil in the world as part of God's "overall plan". We may *speculate* as to why this happens, but no one can say with absolute certainty why it does. As my father used to say, "God only knows, and He ain't tellin' ", which I always took as a pretty direct way of saying "Don't worry about it, God will let us know when we get to Heaven". I'm sure for most of us, in fact, that may be on the top of our list of questions that we'll want to ask God if/when we get to the Kingdom. It is one of life's great mysteries, this question of evil and suffering.

In today's gospel, the disciples ask Jesus to explain the parable about "the weeds and the wheat". In doing so, they are trying to probe the mind and heart of someone who knows all and sees all. Most likely, they don't ask Jesus to explain the parables of the mustard seed and the yeast, because they speak to the same point: the beginnings of the Kingdom here on earth may be small at first, but they are yielding (and will continue to yield) great results. The "weeds and the wheat" is a little trickier, because it seems that prudent thing to do would be to uproot the weeds when they grow; they are, however, "entangled" in the roots of the wheat and thus would uproot the wheat if pulled. One must allow for evil to exist, for at the harvest (read: the end of the world), the harvest master (read: God) will separate the weeds from the wheat and cast them into the furnace (read: Hell), taking the wheat with him into the barn (read: the Kingdom). This requires great patience on our part, a patience which only comes from God.

Let us pray for patient endurance, recognizing the "bigger picture" at work in the plan that God has for us all. Let us know that God, who knows and sees all, will see the good we do and reward that good. Let us pray that we may gathered up with the wheat (i.e. the good people of God) and put into the barn (i.e. the Kingdom) where we will "shine like the sun" (Mt 13:43).

MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY



Today's gospel presents three parables: the "Weeds and the Wheat", "Mustard Seed", and "Yeast and the Dough". All

three are meant as "Kingdom-centered" parables, with the focus on what it means to be a disciple of Jesus, and what it takes to make it to heaven. While Jesus explains only the parable of the weeds and the wheat, I'd like to focus on the parable of the mustard seed and its relation to St. Francis.

One might think that St. Francis had an abundance of faith, and they would be right...as long as they were talking "post-conversion". So much of Francis' life hinges on his encounter with Jesus at the foot of the Cross at San Damiano. Before this moment of faith. Francis' faith could easily be described as LESS THAN "mustard seed-sized". Francis was so focused on the world and its trappings, that any thought of the Kingdom were purely accidental. After San Damiano, however, Francis' focus shifted from the world to the Kingdom, specifically the "rebuilding" of the Church. All it took for Francis' life to change seismically was this "conversation" which St. Francis had with the Lord at the foot of the San Damiano Cross. Francis had a "mustard seed-sized" amount of faith, but Jesus took that and ran with it. Jesus convinced Francis to radically change his life and begin to follow what the Lord asked him to do.

Have you ever had a "mustard seed" moment, with God taking seemingly little and (with your help) growing it into something amazing? Have you ever prayed for God to change your life, even if you only feel like you have a mustard seed-sized faith? Pray that, like St. Francis, God take that "mustard seed" (or yeast) and help you to focus not on the "weeds" in your life, but the "wheat" – those good gifts from God, which we all have – and use them to build up the Kingdom of God and the Body of Christ. May St. Francis' example of faith be an inspiration to you and to us all to follow Him now, and into the Kingdom.
