A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR



My Dear Friends in Christ,

One often hears of someone having the “wisdom of Solomon”. Often times, it is a judge, a teacher, a parent or, in the case of the man himself spoken about in our first reading, a ruler. When Solomon assumes the kingship of Israel (following the death of his father, David), he is visited by God in a dream. When given the opportunity to receive anything he wishes to make his rule successful, he doesn’t opt for the “quick fix” or the “easy out”. In recognizing an apparent shortcoming in being “a mere youth” (1 Kgs 3:7), he opts for “an understanding heart to judge...people and to distinguish right from wrong” (1 Kgs 3:9). Solomon starts off on the “right foot” with God by not being concerned with himself, but with his people.

This gift of **discernment** is a key element to having true wisdom, the God-given variety which we attribute as a Gift of the Holy Spirit. What is it that makes us successful and happy? Surely the world would say “riches” or “power” or “prestige”; this flies in the face, of course, of the life God wants for us. We would do well, like Solomon, to ask (in prayer) for those things (attributes, behaviors, mindsets) which will help us to grow in faith, hope and love. In looking at not merely what we *want* but what we *need*, we grow in the eyes of God. We grow in the gift of Wisdom (a Gift of the Spirit given at Confirmation, free for our use) by discerning, in union with God’s plan for us and for the world, by separating out the wants (which we can pray for, but not necessarily rely on getting) from our needs, that which helps us truly grow in the Spirit. It all works together for our good and the good of the world.

It is in the gifts of discernment and wisdom that help us to determine that which is of true and lasting value, that which will bring to life and light the Kingdom (both the Kingdom awaiting us, as well as the Kingdom in our midst (which, when discerned properly, are one and the same!)). In the gospel, the “treasure in the field” (Mt 13:44) and the “pearl of great price” (Mt 13:46) are images of that Kingdom. These images are used because, like the Kingdom, they are only found by discerning what is lasting from what is fleeting, what is finite from what is infinite. This “separating” is like the “dragnet” (see Mt 13:47) which is cast into the sea and collects fish of all kinds (the fish, in this passage, being an image of humankind); the good (godly) and the bad (worldly) are separated, and the bad is thrown away. In that same way, we will be separated at the end of time with those who have striven to follow God’s way welcomed into the Kingdom.

May we always strive to discern God’s will for us, for our brothers and sisters and for the world. May we look to God for all things which help us to grow in faith, hope and love. Finally, may we continue to (like Solomon) ask (in prayer) for those things which will build up the Kingdom, serve the needs of ourselves and our brothers and sisters, and usher forth the greater glory of God!

Catechists Wanted!

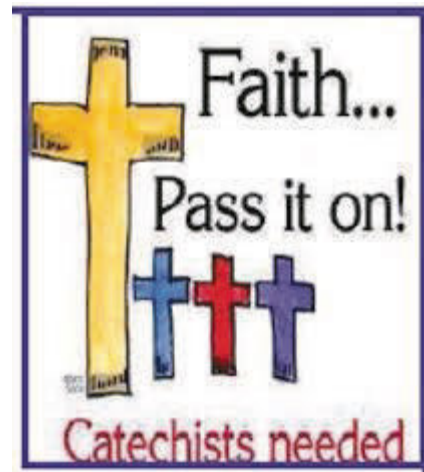
As we prepare for the new faith formation year in the fall, catechists are needed for all grades.

MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

Recently, the Church celebrated the Feast of St. Bonaventure (15 July). St. Bonaventure was a Bishop and Doctor of the Church, so he stands out as not only one of the greatest Franciscan saints, but one of the Church's greatest saints. So who was this man, known as "The Seraphic Doctor"?

Born in 1221 in Bagnoregio (central Italy), St. Bonaventure was given the name Giovanni ("John"). As a very young child, St. Francis of Assisi prayed over him to be healed of a serious childhood disease. It was said that St. Francis could intuit peoples' character; he prophesized about St. Bonaventure's future greatness. It was St. Francis who coined the expression, "O Buona Ventura", which means what "good fortune" he will have. The name stayed with him.

St. Bonaventure entered the Franciscan Order in 1238, and after finishing his studies he became close friends with St. Thomas Aquinas while in Paris. For his astute knowledge and vibrant faith, St. Bonaventure became known as "The Seraphic Doctor". In addition to theological and philosophical works, St. Bonaventure has left us numerous spiritual treatises, some of which have been translated into English including the Journey of the Soul to God, Tree of Life, and The Life of Saint Francis.

Although St. Bonaventure was a man of the highest intellectual attainments, he would emphasize that a fool's love and knowledge of God may be greater than that of a humanly wise man. To reach God, he said, "little attention must be given to reason and great attention to grace, little to books and everything to the gift of God, which is the Holy Spirit." Above all he emphasized charity: "For in truth, a poor and unlearned old woman can love God better than a Doctor of Theology."

St. Bonaventure served as Minister General of the Friars Minor (the Franciscan Order). Bonaventure was nominated as archbishop of York in 1265 by Pope Clement IV, but asked humbly not to be elevated. In 1273, Pope Gregory X obliged him to assume a greater place of honor, that of Bishop-Cardinal of Albano, one of the seven suburb dioceses around Rome. Bonaventure enjoyed special veneration even during his lifetime because of renowned teaching and writing, his preaching of the Word of God, his stainless character, his spiritual power to reconcile opposites, and for the miracles attributed to him.

Bonaventure died in 1400, and was canonized by Pope Sixtus V on 14 April 1482. He was declared a "Doctor of the Church" in 1588 by the same Pope. St. Bonaventure, Seraphic Doctor, Pray For Us!
