A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

My Dear Friends in Christ,

On a trip to Rome in 2017, I had the opportunity to view Raphael's (original) painting of "The Transfiguration", which hangs in the Pinocoteca (meaning "picture gallery") of the Vatican Museums. I had seen it a few years ago, on my first trip to Rome, but each time it is seen the



viewer comes away with some new insight (as is the case with most pieces of art). In this viewing, what struck me was that amidst all the chaos, shock, and confusion of the moment, there are figures in ecstasy looking at the rising Christ. The ones in ecstasy are pointing towards Jesus, and there is one figure in particular that was striking to me. It is the figure of a woman, kneeling in prayer. This woman represents the Church and her serenity amidst the uproar of the scene reminds one that in the upheaval of the world, the Church stands as a manifestation of the transformative nature of faith, especially faith in Christ.

The Feast of the Transfiguration is one of those rare feasts which supersedes the Sunday celebration, "interrupting" our journey through Ordinary Time. It does so because it points to an important truth of our faith, one which does not take the place of the Eucharist and its central importance in our life of faith but enhances the necessity of the Eucharist and its place in our lives. The Transfiguration is an important moment in salvation history because it gives us a glimpse of our future. In Raphael's depiction of the Transfiguration, Peter, James, and John have fallen to the ground, overwhelmed by this moment of faith; it is no wonder, and wouldn't any of us done the same if we were in their place? Here is Jesus, rising in the air, a precursor of His journey back to the Eternal Kingdom, which will happen at the Ascension. It is a hopeful scene, one that gives us a "roadmap" as to our own lives of faith. As Jesus is "transfigured", He gives all who look upon Him the opportunity to unite themselves with the Savior, to put their trust in Him as He shows us what He will look like when He ascends to the Father.

This depiction of the Transfiguration highlights another important truth of our faith. Raphael's painting shows many different figures, some in rapture, some in torment. There is even a "demonic" figure (a possessed young boy, actually, in the lower right hand corner), showing to us that even when Christ is present, evil is present as well. The Transfiguration painting reminds us, however, that "where sin abounds, grace abounds all the more" (Romans 5:20). The demonic can never overtake the Heavenly, and evil can never overtake good. There may be, for a time, a seeming triumph of evil in the world, but Raphael reminds us that at the heart of one's life of faith is Christ, transformed in nature, transforming us in love.

May we have the courage to look beyond the chaos and evil in the world. May we know that Christ is in all things and above all things. May we trust that where Jesus has gone, we shall follow and that when there is disorder in our lives, Christ brings order. May we, one day, live in the presence of the risen, transformed, Christ in the Eternal Kingdom of God's Eternal Love.

We will be hosting 4 movie nights over the course of the summer, 2 at each parish. There will be free popcorn and other snacks available for purchase.



MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

Today the Church celebrates the Feast of the Transfiguration. In the gospel, Jesus brings Peter, James, and John up a high mountain and shows them His glorified


form, how He will look in the Kingdom. This is a pivotal moment in the ministry of Jesus, as well as in the lives of the three disciples who were chosen to accompany Jesus in this moment of profound faith.

In the dictionary, a "transfiguration" is described as "a complete change of form or appearance into a more beautiful or spiritual state". Simply put, it is how God sees us, how we are meant to be and how to live. One could say that St. Francis not only had a moment of "transfiguration" as he knelt before the Cross at San Damiano, but also from what happened when he encountered the leper on the road, and in the town square that day in Assisi when he stripped himself of his garments, handed them to his father, and professed his new life to the Bishop. These changes were the catalyst for a "more beautiful or spiritual state", one in which St. Francis saw himself as God saw him. These changes then affected not only St. Francis, but the (soon-to-be-formed) Franciscan Order, and the Church Universal.

When we look at the changes which St. Francis had happen to him/undertook, this could/should cause us to take a look at our own life and see who it is God is calling us to be, how it is God is calling us to live. May we have the courage of St. Francis to allow ourselves to be "transfigured" into the people who God is calling us to be.

We have all had moments when we seem to get a glimpse of Heaven.
