

Flowers Memorial this week is for:

Patrícia Robichaud & Míchael Robichaud My Dear Friends in Christ,

I know all about begging dogs. Those of you who know me know my faithful canine companion, Nellie (the "parish



pup", as she was once called). She is a master at "puppy dog eyes", that look that a dog can give that will make you "cave in" to anything! She will sit patiently (for the most part) waiting for any little scrap or morsel to fall from your utensil, ready to grab it (often before it hits the floor!) and claim it for his own.


Jesus uses the image of a dog begging for scraps to describe those people who, initially, He wasn't called to save. Jesus even goes so far as to openly deny them a "place at table". In the beginning of Jesus' public ministry, He made it clear that He came to save "the lost sheep of the house of Israel" (Mt 15:24); it, seemingly, wasn't in the plan of salvation to save anyone else. In this encounter with the Canaanite woman, Jesus' mission takes a different sort of turn. The woman (whose faith is evident) doesn't seem afraid to challenge Jesus in His thought process; she doesn't move Jesus from this analogous thinking, but gets Him to "expand" His thoughts and, perhaps, His heart.

There are times in our lives when we might feel, to some degree, like that Canaanite woman. We may feel the need to reach out to Jesus but, unlike this bold woman, might be afraid of approaching the Lord, fearful of rejection. We must know in our heart that we have a God who loves us fully, One who knows us to the core of our being, One who can move us from a place of doubt and fear to surety and confidence. The Canaanite woman approaches Jesus fully aware of whom He is; when she refers to Him as "Son of David", she is acknowledging Jesus' place in the kingly lineage of Joseph's ancestor, King David. She not only knows *about* Him, she knows *Him*. It is this knowledge, and Jesus understanding and acceptance of the Canaanite woman's faith that brings about this moment of healing.

May we have the courage to approach the Throne of Grace upon which Jesus sits. May we come to trust that we, despite our own unworthiness, are made worthy by the One who calls us to relationship with Himself. May we believe that healing, in whatever way needed, will be ours. May we share this knowledge with all whom we meet.

MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

Today's gospel centers around the mission of Jesus and its expansion beyond the "Chosen People" (i.e., Israelite community). Jesus is approached by a Canaanite woman whose

daughter is being tormented by a demon. At first, Jesus dismisses the request because of the fact that the woman (and her daughter) are not part of the "chosen people". Jesus even goes so far as to compare the honoring of the woman's request to throwing good food to dogs. This may seem harsh, but Jesus always has something in mind and this encounter with the Canaanite woman is no exception. Ultimately, Jesus sees the woman's humble faith as worthy of honoring her plea, and the woman's daughter is healed.

The Franciscans know about begging. They are, by definition, a "mendicant order", one which "owns" nothing and holds everything in common for all in the Order. They are also reliant on the kindness of others, soliciting donations to support and further the mission of their Order. Usually, one or two within a community are responsible for supplying the needs of the others in the community. Often times, this is done by begging, sometimes overtly and sometimes in more subtle ways. In either case, the reliance on others for their well-being is a well-known trait of the Franciscan Order (as well as other religious orders).

When it comes to begging, however, many assume that the Franciscan perspective on almsgiving is largely connected to its perspective on poverty. But the focus of almsgiving is actually on giving, not receiving. In the Early Rule of Franciscan life, the chapter titled "Manner of Serving and Working" placed the priority on work. Work was the means to be with and among the people, the support the common life among the friars, and to have the means to support the poor by almsgiving. Only when a friar is unable to work or find work, may a friar beg for alms. Even then, those very alms were, in part, destined for almsgiving. Even in the instance when a friar was seeking to provide on the behalf of others, work took a priority over begging. So consistent is this view that Francis expressed it in *The Testament*, a final written exhortation for his brothers as he lay dying. In Francis' perspective, alms were not a means of supporting the Franciscan way of life of poverty, but were the means to serve and draw closer to God. In the same *Earlier Rule*, in Chapter 10, *Begging* Alms, the practice is described as following the humility and poverty of Jesus, but in the sense that the purpose was to serve the poor. "Alms are a legacy and justice due to the poor that our Lord Jesus Christ acquired for us."

So let us be like St. Francis, and allow ourselves to be placed closer to the Lord through our humility. May our association with the Canaanite woman help us to see Jesus for who He is – healer, consoler, and Lord.
