A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

My Dear Friends in Christ,

Like with a lot of things in life, forgiveness and reconciliation is a process



- it doesn't just "happen". In today's gospel, the four-step process of reconciliation is as follows: one-on-one, going with a friend, calling in the church, treating them (the one who wronged you) like you would "a Gentile or tax collector" (an outsider with no standing in the community) (Mt 18:17). It seems as if Jesus is contradicting the idea of forgiving "seventy times seven times" (Mt 18:22, in the passage immediately following today's gospel). One has to look carefully at the passage to see that the two ideas (treating one like an outsider and forgiving unconditionally) are not contradictory.

There are some times when one has to "give it over to God" (a stock phrase of my mother's). In doing this one is allowing God to work in the life of the person who has wronged us in a way that we cannot. Sin must be challenged when it is seen, but it must be done in the most effective way possible. This is the reasoning behind the "escalation" found in the process of forgiveness in today's gospel. One begins by allowing the person to repent/apologize without "going public". If this is unsuccessful, then one brings in a "third party" (one, it is assumed, who knows both parties) to provide objective counsel. If this does not work, you bring in the church (the competent authority which has the power to "bind" and "loose" (as referred to in Mt 18:18)). Finally, when these avenues have been exhausted, then one who has wronged is commended to God (so that the Almighty can work in the person's life).

It can be a challenging thing, to confront sin and to be confronted by one's own sin. It is a humbling experience both for the offending and aggrieved parties. If one is open to correction, and if one is bold enough to correct, then healing can take place. If not, the only remedy is to allow God to work in both party's lives. If this is done, then healing can still take place, in God's own time; at times such as this, only God's power can "do the job".

May we have the courage to both confront and be confronted by sin. May we know the healing power of God through forgiveness and reconciliation. May we feel this healing power by being conduits and receptacles of forgiveness. May we "let God be God" in our lives and in the lives of all whom we meet.


In the next few weeks, we will be running a ministry spotlight in the bulletin so you can learn more about our ministries.

MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

In today's gospel, Jesus instructs His disciples how to deal with sinners. They are to first confront them one-on-one, (secondly) they are then to bring in another (a "third party"), finally (if

the first two methods fail) they are to commend them to God and have nothing to do with them. The hope is that conversion, forgiveness, and healing takes place somewhere along the way.

When one looks at the saints, one can easily forget that they are human. So often, we focus on the virtues of the saints and we forget that they are human and, thus, sinners. The thing that makes them saints is that they did not remain in their sinfulness but came to conversion, often through the words and actions of another. Sometimes, it is Christ Himself that comes to the person and challenges them to see the error of their ways and to come to a relationship with Him. St. Francis came to his moment of healing and conversion after hearing that voice in the San Damiano chapel to "rebuild my church". To do this, St. Francis knew that he had to change his ways, give up the world, and take up the Cross of Christ. When he heard those famous and important words, St. Francis knew that he had to radically change his views, his life, and even his clothes, so that this change may be whole, complete, and life-long.

St. Francis knew about sin. No doubt, there were many elements of his life prior to his conversion that would be considered sinful not only by the Church, but by God Himself. When St. Francis heard the call to rebuild the church", he took it quite literally (as the structure he was standing in was falling apart). Christ, however, meant it figuratively, as He meant for St. Francis to restructure the Church, or at least some of it, so that it was more in line with Christ's mission for the world. Because St. Francis knew about sin (being a sinner, himself), he could spot it and correct it. This was a God who knew that despite Francis' sinfulness, He could be used to bring others to Christ by spotting that sinfulness and correct it.

May we have the courage to recognize the sin in our lives and the grace to ask for forgiveness. May we, like St. Francis, listen to the voice of God in our hearts and heed the call to conversion to a life of grace and God's peace. May we then, in turn, through the intercession of St. Francis, sinner and saint, be instruments of that peace.
