A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

My Dear Friends in Christ,

I've often felt that resentment and forgiveness are "two sides of the same coin". Often times, our



inability to forgive is linked with our unwillingness to let go. If we do not let go the hurts of the past, we cannot move forward towards the future. One of my favorite quotes (from Carrie Fisher, in her semi-autobiography "Postcards From The Edge") states that "resentment is like drinking poison, and waiting for the other person to die". So often, the person who has harmed us has moved on from an incident in which we have been hurt and we have not – we are still holding on. Forgiveness can only occur if we are willing to move on into the future. Note that this "moving on" does not mean "forgetting"; if we forget, the possibility of reoccurrence increases and (often) intensifies. Think of the classic example of the child and the hot stove; the child cannot forget the pain of touching the hot stove, lest they get burned again, but they can learn (and even grow) from it. In the same way, we cannot (and should not) forget about getting "burned" by a hurtful incident, but we can (and should) move forward with the knowledge of that incident in our minds so that it doesn't happen again. I think the old maxim of "forgive and forget" could, more aptly be phrased "forgive and move forward".

In today's gospel, Peter asks Jesus "Lord...how often must I forgive? As many as seven times?" (Mt 18:21). Jesus surprises Peter by telling him, "I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times" (Mt 18:22). In saying this, one is not to be counting "seventy-five...seventy-six...seventyseven...okay, I'm done!" Jesus is reminding Peter (and us, in our listening) that forgiveness is an ongoing thing that it is to happen as often as we are hurt. This is a hard truth, one that is not easy to wrap one's head around. The parable of the master and servant is an illustration of letting go. The servant is forgiven his debt, but does not extend the same courtesy to a fellow servant. He fails to "pay it forward", if you will. In doing so, he incurs the wrath of his master. The master, in turn, requires full repayment from the first servant because he failed to do for another that which was done for him.

We are called, as people of faith, to adhere to the principle of forgiveness in the measure in which we are willing to forgive. If we forgive greatly, we will be forgiven greatly; if we forgive sparingly, we will be forgiven sparingly. We are to extend to others the mercy, compassion, and love which God extends to us. May we come to know this mercy from God, and when we receive it may we be ready willing and able to bestow this gift on others.

Volunteer Drive



MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

St. Francis of Assisi has always been considered a great man of forgiveness. Why? Because he recognized the power of forgiveness and the impact it could have in healing and transforming men and women. He also lived out this truth. Here is a story from his life that demonstrates this in a dramatic way.

One day Francis met an acquaintance of his who looked troubled, and he asked him: "Brother, how are things with you?" The man immediately began to rant against his master, saying, "Thanks to my master — May God curse him! — I have had nothing but misfortune. He has taken away all that I possess."

Francis was filled with pity for the man, and said, "Brother, pardon your master for the love of God, and free your own soul; it's possible that he will restore to you whatever he has taken away. Otherwise, you have lost your goods and will lose your soul as well." But the man said, "I can't fully forgive him unless he returns what he has taken from me." Francis answered, "Look, I will give you this cloak; I beg you to forgive your master for the love of the Lord God." The man's heart was melted by this kindness, and he forgave his master. Immediately, he was filled with joy.

St. Francis was truly a man of forgiveness, a peacemaker who became a channel of God's grace to others. We can become like St. Francis. When we pray for those who have offended us, it frees us to love as God loves. God's grace has power not only to change us, but those who have done us injury as well.
