

My Dear Friends in Christ,

Growing up, whenever we encountered something (either by viewing or experiencing) that we didn't think was fair we said something to my parents; inevitably, the response was always the same – "life isn't always fair". While this shocked us (less so, unfortunately, as we got older), we came to see the truth in it. Because of the human condition, and the need for some to "get a leg up" on someone else, life didn't always "balance". There always seemed to be injustice, and there was a certain level of acceptance. The thing which made it seem more "balanced" was the fact that we were assured that God saw all, and that justice would ultimately prevail.

In today's gospel, there appears a level of injustice at work. In seeing both the full-day laborers and those who work only an hour getting the same amount of pay, one can't help but feel a "twinge" of resentment; imagine yourself in that situation, and you might feel that you deserve more, as the workers in today's gospel do. The landowner, however, is free to dispense his money as he sees fit – this is his right. This parable is meant to serve as an indication of the generosity of God. There are some who "toil in the vineyard" day in, day out; these can be seen as the "cradle Catholics" who were born into the faith. There are others, converts to the faith, who are akin to those who "only work one hour"; they come later to the faith, and are seen by many as deserving less. God, however, does not work on the principle of "first come, first served". God provides as He sees fit, being generous to all who labor for Him. It may seem that converts to the faith get better treatment, but in reality they are only getting what God sees fit to give them – as is God's right. This idea cannot deter or detract us from doing the work, as Catholic-Christians, to which the Church calls us. We are all called, regardless how we as human beings see it, to work unceasingly for the good of the Church and the building up of the Kingdom here on earth.

May we come to see the work that we do as beneficial to all – those who are "cradle Catholics" and those who, through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, have come into the faith later in life. May we all work together to build up the Kingdom here on earth, so that one day we may see the fullness of that Kingdom in heaven.

Be Sure to Look the Part

I used to coach my oldest son in soccer when he was younger. As he got older, he would go to tryouts for select and high school teams. I was no longer the coach, but I always shared with him one piece of advice before any tryout: Be sure to look the part. I told him that if he showed up looking like a soccer player, there was an increased chance of him being seen as a soccer player. If he showed up looking like a kid that plays soccer in video games as opposed to the real thing, he might not be taken seriously. As he grew older, that same advice was then applied to getting a job. It's advice I have heeded myself all my life. You can even say it is like another common phrase: "Fake it till you make it."

As disciples of Jesus Christ, we certainly do not want to fake it, but we do need to look the part. The world looks at those of us who proclaim to be Christians to see if there is anything to this way of life. If they see us looking and acting like people transformed by Jesus Christ, they will be more likely to take Christianity seriously. If they look at us and see nothing different, then they can easily conclude that there is nothing different about Jesus Christ. He just becomes simply another religious figure of history. Can the world see the power of Christ in you? How will do you look the part?

As people begin to come back to Mass and those of us who have been attending become more relaxed after having attended Mass for a few weeks, it is important that we continue to follow the guidelines set up to ensure our safety.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ATTENDING MASS — YOU MUST REGISTER FOR MASS. USE OUR WEBSITE TO DO SO.

- * In order to limit social gathering and allow time to seat registered parishioners, those attending Mass should arrive no earlier than 30 minutes and no later than 15 minutes before the start of Mass. (Seats will then be offered to those parishioners on 'standby' who arrived without pre-registration.)
- * One entrance: Entry into church will be front right and left side doors (no entry through middle doors) at St. John's, front door at St. Ann's. PLEASE NOTE THAT IN SEATING PEOPLE (ASIDE FROM THOSE WITH PHYSICAL CHALLENGES), DUE TO SAFETY PROTOCOLS IN PLACE, WE CANNOT GUARANTEE YOU A PARTICULAR SEAT IN THE CHURCH.
- * All parishioners must wear masks. There are several exceptions, such as: children under the age of two, and people with underlying health conditions. The wearing of masks for children between the ages of 2-5 is based on the parents' discretion.
- * Parishioners should bring their own hand sanitizer if possible. The church will have limited supply.
- * Parishioners must maintain 6 feet of social distance between each other at all times. This does not apply to families that live in the same household.
- * Appropriate social distancing spaces will be designated on the floor/in the aisles. Ushers will provide guidance.
- * Everyone will enter church using front doors and leave church using side doors. Those closest to the front doors will leave first
- * There will be no sign of peace, offertory collection or singing during Mass. Baskets for financial contributions will be available as you leave church.
- * Special instructions on receiving Holy Communion will be presented during each Mass. (Please be patient; wait for instructions by the ushers everyone will be served.)
- * To prevent close contact, the clergy will employ minimal entrancing in or recessing out of the church. (Please wait for the Ushers to exit after the Priest and Deacon have exited.)
- * Public gatherings before or after Mass are not permitted outside church.

AN IMPORTANT NOTE:

If you are uneasy about attending such an event, please remember that the Dispensation from Reception of Communion is still in effect. If you are in the "vulnerable/at risk" category, please remember that you need not (nor would I want you to) risk your health and well-being. It is for this reason that I will still be taping Sunday Mass (broadcast on EB-CAM and posted on Facebook/parish websites) and live-streaming Daily Mass on Facebook.
