

PLEAE HELP.

My Dear Friends in Christ,

"There is no saint without a past, no sinner without a future". This quote, one of my favorites, by Saint Augustine, sums up how we should feel about the saints and about ourselves. When we think of the saints, I think we tend to "idolize" them, turning them into some unapproachable creation whose status we have no hope of attaining. Nothing could be further from the truth! We are all, as I like to say, "saints in training", and we all have the possibility of reaching the status of those who we hold dear in the Kingdom of Heaven.

Today the Church celebrates the Solemnity of All Saints. This solemnity, which has its roots in the Eastern Church, came to be celebrated in the West around the 9th century. It was transferred from May to November 1st by Pope Gregory IV. It is interesting, but I don't think accidental, that this feast immediately precedes All Souls' Day (November 2nd), as the saints (who are in heaven) can intercede for us on behalf of the faithful departed. We can pray for the dead by praying through the intercession of those who are "fully alive" in the Kingdom. In this way, the dead and the living are "linked" by our desire for Heaven.

Today's Gospel gives us the Beatitudes, which serve as a "blueprint" for living in union and relationship with Christ. When Jesus offered the crowd this teaching, it was a radical way of living, When one looks at those who are "blessed" in the eyes of the Lord, they are people who aren't necessarily "lifted up" in high regard by society. It is the poor in spirit, the mournful, the meek, those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, the merciful, the clean of heart, the peacemakers, and those who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness. These are not exactly the "high and mighty" that society tends to hold up as models of living in our society. It is exactly these, however, who Jesus calls us to be like and will receive their heavenly reward.

May we strive to be like the saints, men and women who are not unlike us. They were ordinary people who chose, in following God, to live extraordinary lives. May we know the peace they knew by following Christ with our whole heart. May we seek the Lord above all else, and before all else. May we, one day, share in the fullness of life in the Kingdom by bringing to life God's Kingdom here on earth. May we share this Kingdom "vision" with all whom we meet.

My Dear Friends in Christ,

As we head into the fall, we as a Church/Collaborative are faced with as many questions as answers. At this point, as your Pastor, I have to ask the critical questions about how we will go forward as the Catholic presence in East and West Bridgewater. The pandemic has served to highlight what was already a reality for our Collaborative, and for many other parishes and collaboratives in the Archdiocese and around the country.

It has become clear to me based on our financials, and the long-term trends in giving and parishioner engagement before the pandemic, that we need to think creatively about new ways to serve the Catholic population of our two towns. We have been in "maintenance-mode" for a number of years, and now it's clear that we can't keep repeating the same thing and expect different results. In order to become "mission-oriented" and be able to meet the spiritual needs of today, we need to consider different solutions, methods, and structures.

Being faithful to our mission to be a strong Catholic presence in our two towns - evangelizing, preaching, teaching, celebrating the sacraments - calls us to make decisions that free us to carry out those tasks in whatever conditions come our way. One those decisions centers around the issue of merger that many of our Archdiocesan entities have faced recently, including our neighbors in the Tri-Parishes of Brockton. The very idea of merger wasn't even a consideration before the downward trends of the last couple of years, and has been brought into consideration even more so because of the effects of the pandemic, effects being felt by so many in our communities – in our businesses and in our own homes.

It is in light of all of this that I have consulted with my "Archdiocesan Collaborative Support Team", as well as the Staff, and Parish (Pastoral and Finance) Councils. They helped me look at what this would mean for the Together In Christ Collaborative, and how best to move forward into the future. It is now the time in the process where I turn to you, the faithful. It is not only imperative but mandated, that I speak with you before any final decisions are made. I cannot, and will not, move forward without giving you every opportunity to allow your voices to be heard. This will be done through various methods available in the next week or so in a myriad of electronic and print media, that will give everyone an opportunity to have their voices heard. I pray that these discussions will help the parishes move the mission of our faith communities forward to a stronger footing so as to serve the People of God in our midst.

In closing, I would like to offer a caution, if I may, **which I cannot emphasize strongly enough**. At **no point i**n these previous conversations with the Archdiocese, Staff or Councils did I entertain the idea of closing either of our churches. This was not the intent of the Collaboration process, nor is it the intent of the merger process. In both cases, the intention is to strengthen and solidify the parishes, albeit in different ways. In speaking with you by various forms of media, I will elaborate on how the process is undertaken and what the results would be. Again, the intention here is to strengthen our position as a Catholic presence in our section of "the Bridgewaters", in our place in the Archdiocese, and in the wider Universal Church. I look forward to speaking with you further in the near future. In the meantime, I ask for your prayers for me, as your Pastor, to make the best possible decisions in this matter and in all matters. May God continue to watch over us, bless us, and guide us, now and into the Kingdom.

Cardinal O'Malley Statement Pope Francis comments on Civil Unions October 22, 2020

Quite understandably, the Holy Father's recent statements concerning civil unions have captured the attention of the world press, because many people are anxious for the Church to change its position on marriage and family. Pope Francis strongly and consistently teaches that marriage is between a man and woman for a lifetime and that this is God's plan for having and raising children.

The Pope's endorsement of civil unions is not an endorsement of homosexual activity. Just as the Church does not campaign against civil laws that allow for common-law marriage or second marriages that are not sacramental, even though such arrangements can be in violation of the laws of the Church, the Holy Father recognizes that in civil society there can be cogent reasons to enact such laws providing for civil unions which are not the same as the institution of marriage.

Pope Francis has seen civil unions as a way for governments to provide protections and health care for couples in long-term, committed relationships, whether they be siblings or friends or partners. Such arrangements are not always of a sexual nature.

The Holy Father is very aware of the suffering and alienation of homosexual individuals, gay people, who are rejected by family and society. He is also keenly aware of the parents and loved ones who also suffer because a member of their family is bullied or marginalized for being different. The demands of sexual morality are very challenging for anyone seeking to lead a life of faithful discipleship. We do not serve people well by falsely claiming that we can change the Decalogue. Our task is to show people that we love them and care about them and that together we can strive to be better people, more generous, more courageous and more faithful to what God is calling us to do.

Dear Holy saints of God. we join our prayers of praise to yours this day. With you, we sing of God's goodness, rejoice in God's mercy and celebrate God's incredible love. Teach us to live as you lived always thinking of others, always recognizing our weaknesses, always reioicing in God's gifts. always closely following Jesus. Blessed are you, happy are you, all you holy saints of God. Pray for us that we, too, may someday be among God's Holy Ones.


All Soul's Day November 2
