



When I work with parents with regards to the children's religious education, I always caution them not be the type

who falls under the axiom, "do as I say, not as I do". I encourage them to lead by example, and to model a pattern of faith that is both active and engaging. If they attend Mass, pray regularly, and follow Christian principles through the Church's teaching, they not only "practice what they preach" but they also enrich their own lives. Finally, in saying all of this, I caution them not to be too hard on themselves. If they have been out of practice when it comes to these things, it may take a while to "get up to speed". I encourage them to take "baby steps" and not do too much, too soon. In all of this, I offer my own word of encouragement and support, letting them know that I am here for them in whatever way they need.

The scribes and Pharisees, the leaders and law givers of Jesus' day, are being called out in no uncertain terms here by Jesus. He is telling His disciples to "do as they say, not as they do". He is cautioning His disciples because the scribes and Pharisees are "talking the talk" but aren't "walking the walk"; their words and their actions are out of sync with one another. It is for this reason that Jesus tells them to "do and observe all things whatsoever they tell you, but do not follow their example" (Mt 23:3). Jesus often called them out for their hypocrisy, and He proceeds to tell His disciples the ways that they are not acting, speaking, and living in a way that is in accordance to the teachings of the Law.

The primary way that Jesus led His disciples is by way of "servant leadership". Jesus came, He tells us, to serve and not be served. In this way, the "other" (the one being served) can then "pay it forward" by serving another. It is this type of leadership that is present in the ministry of Jesus, and it is the type that should be present in any ministry we perform in the Church. If we are called to engage ourselves in a ministry (that was either placed upon our hearts by God or called forth by one in the Church), then we should do so with an eye towards what we can do for others, not what others can do for us or what we can get out of it.

There is "but one teacher...one Father...one master" (Mt 23:8-10); we, for our part, are students, children, and servants of that One. It is God who calls us to relationship and to service. May we have the courage to enter into that relationship with full and open hearts. May we have the courage to enter into service with an eye towards the other, especially the poor, marginalized, and downtrodden. May we know God's love, and share it with all whom we meet.

MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

Today's gospel is rife with hypocrisy from the Pharisees. They would impose burden-

some restrictions on others, but fail to live up to those same expectations for themselves. It was a classic case of "do as I say, not as I do". Jesus calls them out on this calling for His disciples to follow their words but not their example. St. Francis never had any such problem. In establishing the Franciscan Order, St. Francis never asked the brothers to do anything or go anywhere that he, himself was not willing to do or go. He had no hypocrisy in his leadership, and he was truly a "servant leader". If we were to look at the "leadership style" of St. Francis, one could say it was carried out in the following ways:

Leaders take the path

of <u>most</u> resistance — No one who has ever achieved anything significant has ever flown under the radar - or taken the easy way. If Saint Francis's stripping himself nude in the town square teaches us anything at all, it's that he nakedly followed the naked Christ — he put into practice what God was telling him to do.

Leaders are prepared to turn their backs on the old way — To achieve what others think is impossible often means putting yourself in situations that make you grow. The downside? These situations are new, uncomfortable, and emotionally traumatizing to go through.

Leaders embrace humility — Making a lasting change and doing what hasn't been done will require you to check your ego before you begin. Why? Because you will experience much humiliation in the pursuit of your mission. You will have to tolerate much social pressure. You will not fit in. And without your ego driving you forward —you will be okay with it.

St. Francis certainly lived out these principles, and encouraged his followers to do the same. He was not afraid to take chances, follow a new way of living, and live a life of simplicity and humility. In asking his followers to do this, he set the path before them as Christ did for him. May we be so bold.

Who is most at risk for human trafficking?

Human trafficking can happen to anyone but some people are more vulnerable than others. Significant risk factors include recent migration or relocation, substance use, mental health concerns, involvement with the children welfare system and being a runaway or homeless youth.

Who are the Traffickers?

Perpetrators of human trafficking span all racial, ethnic, and gender demographics and are as diverse as survivors. Some use their privilege, wealth, and power as a means of control while others experience the same socio-economic oppression as their victims. They include individuals, business owners, members of a gang or network, parents or family members of victims, intimate partners, owners of farms or restaurants, and powerful corporate executives and government representatives.

Have you considered living a Cursillo?

Cursillo is an active three-day learning experience in basic Christianity featuring practical insights into an everyday life of faith and service. It is a unique experience and offers us an opportunity to develop, nurture, and deepen our own personal relationship with Jesus Christ.
