

My Dear Friends in Christ,



It has been said that the difference between "wisdom" and "knowledge" is this":

knowledge is understanding that a tomato is (botanically) a fruit and that wisdom is knowing not to put a tomato in a fruit salad. There is a difference between knowing about something and being wise about it. One (knowledge) comes from a learned experience and one (wisdom) comes from a lived experience. There is a vast difference between knowing about something and truly having lived it out. I have found that in my life, to truly know something, the best way to come to the fullest understanding of an event or experience is to have that first-hand encounter.

In today's gospel, Jesus recounts the "Parable of the Ten Virgins". In this parable, which a story that points to a greater experience, there are ten virgins – five who are wise, five who are foolish. They are all awaiting the bridegroom, and have taken their lamps out into the darkness to meet him. The wise ones bring extra oil, "just in case" (the bridegroom is delayed), and the foolish ones have no oil with them (save for what is in their lamps, which will eventually run out). The bridegroom is inevitably delayed and the virgins fall asleep. Upon waking, and as the bridegroom approaches, the foolish ones ask for oil from the wise ones. Since there may not be enough, they refuse the request. Upon returning (after going out to buy more oil), the foolish virgins are refused entrance into the wedding feast which has begun.

The "moral" of the story, Jesus tells the listener, is "stay awake, for you know neither the day nor the hour" (Matthew 25:13). The point of the story for us is that we are those awaiting the "bridegroom" (Jesus) and that we need to be ready when He comes, whenever that may be. Since we do not know the day nor the hour, it is imperative that we always be vigilant. Does this mean that we just sit around? Hardly. We have daily tasks that need accomplishing, we have work to do in this life which cannot be ignored. Our primary "job", however, is to be ready for the coming of the Kingdom. This is why we pray (in The Our Father) "thy Kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven". The Kingdom isn't just something for which we wait, it is something in our midst already and we are called to build it here. When we work as "Kingdom Builders", we bring to fruition our baptismal call. When we work to bring Jesus' vision to life, we fulfill our role as disciples of Jesus.

Let us always be vigilant in awaiting the Master's return. Let us always be ready to welcome the "Bridegroom" when He comes. Let us trim our lamps and keep them lit, for one day – a day which we do not know but which will happen. Let us build up the Kingdom here on earth, so that we may live in the fullness of the Kingdom in Heaven.

#### Cardinal O'Malley Statement Regarding Archbishop Wilton D. Gregory being Named to the College of Cardinals.

Pope Francis's elevation of Archbishop Wilton D. Gregory of Washington, D.C. to the College of Cardinals is an historic event, a personal tribute and a blessing for the Church in the United States.

The historic character of the Pope's decision is the appointment of the first African American to the College of Cardinals. For several decades there have been African American bishops in the Church in the United States, but this appointment is a singular event recognizing the contribution of the African American community to the work of the Church in this country.

The Holy Father's choice, of course, is not simply about history. It is a recognition of the personal qualities and fruitful pastoral ministry of Cardinal-elect Gregory. Ordained as an auxiliary bishop for the Archdiocese of Chicago, then Bishop of Belleville, Illinois, Cardinal-elect Gregory later led the Archdiocese of Atlanta for more than fourteen years, before being appointed to the See of Washington, D.C. in 2019. He also served as the President of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops from 2001-2004.

The long and valiant struggle for racial justice in this country from the 17th century to the inspiring events of 2020 has been given a powerful acknowledgment by the Holy Father whose voice for social justice, human dignity and equality has been a hallmark of his papacy.

Throughout his ministry Cardinal-elect Gregory has been a consistent advocate of these same themes, addressing them through faith, reason and his own personal experience as an African American priest and bishop. Based on this personal and pastoral experience, Cardinal-elect Gregory will bring wisdom, insight and a passion for justice to the College of Cardinals, the Holy Father's uniquely important collaborators. We offer prayerful best wishes to Cardinal-elect Gregory and gratitude to Pope Francis for this appointment.

O God, Great and Almighty creator, we thank and praise You for the freedom we enjoy in our



Thank You for America's heroes, that have fought for our freedoms and who have faithfully served our country. We honor all of our veterans, for their sacrifices and for their courange and integrity.


