A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

My Dear Friends in Christ,

I have a friend of mine whose son just joined the Coast Guard. I'm always heartened when one of our young people feels the call



to serve his or her country so deeply as to enlist in one of the Armed Services. Each branch has its own motto, and for the Coast Guard it is "Semper Paratus" - "Always Ready". It is a testament to the preparedness with which those in the Coast Guard undertake their daily duties. It is a good motto, and one that is fitting for today's gospel.

In today's gospel passage from Matthew, there is an image of a wedding feast within the text but that is not the focus. The thing to which one should pay attention is the actions of the virgins. As they wait for the bridegroom, the evening moves on and the groom is delayed in coming. The virgins fall asleep and upon the arrival of the bridegroom, they are hastily beckoned into the feast. The wise virgins have prepared for the possibility of the groom's delay by having "extra" supplies. The foolish virgins have accounted for no such possibility and are caught short. They beg the wise women for some of their oil, but because there may not be enough for all they are "left out in the cold". After getting the needed supplies, the foolish virgins find themselves shut out, with the bridegroom disavowing any knowledge of the women.

This parable, alluding the Kingdom of Heaven, is one which reminds us that we must always be prepared for the coming of the "bridegroom" – the Lord. When He comes to invite us to the "wedding banquet" – entrance into the Eternal Kingdom – we must be ready to join Him. We should be careful to prepare for all possibilities, for we "know neither the day nor the hour" (Mt 25:13). In other words, when the Lord comes to invite us to join Him in the Kingdom it shouldn't matter WHEN that happens. When Jesus comes calling, we need to be ready to go with Him for He will not ask again. When the Lord comes, it will be a "one-time offer", and it will not come again.

May we prepare our minds, our hearts, and our very lives for the coming of the Lord. May we be ready when the Lord makes an invitation to us to join him in the Kingdom. May we live each day as our last, knowing that this could be the day that the Lord calls us Home. May the Lord, when He comes calling, find us ready, willing, and able to join with Him in the Kingdom.

The November date is 11/20 at 6:30 pm at St. John. All are welcome to join us! This can count for part of the parish service requirement for Confirmation as service hours


November Teen Mass

MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

On 11 November, every year, our nation celebrates Veterans Day. It is a time set aside so that we can thank those men and women

who served our country proudly and well. It is an important time to give thanks for the gift of freedom that we enjoy today. Why do I mention Veterans Day in my Franciscan column? I'll explain.

Before St. Francis' conversion, he had dreams of being a knight. Knights were in a "class by themselves", so to speak. A knight is also a soldier but a knight is a professional soldier who receives extensive training since he is just a small boy. When he was a small boy, he is known as a page boy. He is just like a very young servant of a knight. This teaches him to be humble. When he became a teenager, he would become a squire. He would serve the knight in the battlefield and fight alongside the knight in the battlefield. When the squire has proven his skills and bravery in the battlefield, he would be knighted as a knight. Most of the knights are from noble family too.

As for medieval soldiers, it could be a general term comprising of peasants who do not have adequate military training but to be armed during war times. Soldiers could also mean mercenaries hired by the king or a medieval lord. Basically medieval soldiers could be anybody armed to fight, even without military training. But knights are soldiers who receive extensive training in warfare, combat and various living skills.

So Francis, as a knight, would have looked towards this life as a lifestyle more than just a job. He would have seen this as a noble way of using his God-given gifts to the best of their use and ability. He would have perhaps seen the life which he lived after his conversion as "noble enough", but far too simple and meager for him. Interestingly enough, after his conversion, Francis became a "knight" of a different sort. He became one who fought not for king and country, but THE King of Kings and for the Kingdom of God. May we honor our military personnel who served not only country and its people, but also who sacrificed selffulfillment for the benefit of others. May their service be honored on Veterans Day, and all days, and may we strive to serve God in our brothers and sisters.


Pray for salvation of people being trafficked.

Today, the United Nations has established **18 November**, as an official World Day for the Prevention of and Healing from Child Sexual Exploitation, Abuse, and Violence. The data is staggering: Around 1 in 4 girls and 1 in 9 boys across the globe experience sexual violence before their eighteenth birthday.

The UN has a three-pronged strategy to address misconduct: **prevention of misconduct, enforcement of UN standards of conduct, and remedial action**.

As a further measure to enhance transparency and accountability, the 2015 report of the Secretary-General on Special measures for the protection from sexual exploitation and sexual abuse (A/71/729) included, for the first time, country-specific information for allegations involving uniformed personnel. The Secretary-General has emphasized that it should be seen as a matter of honour when a Member State takes decisive action against perpetrators of sexual exploitation and abuse. It is encouraging to note that best practices are starting to emerge among Member States, ranging from enhancing pre-deployment training, conducting effective and thorough investigations and timely reporting, holding on-site court martial proceedings and imposing strict sanctions for perpetrators, to appointing focal points in the national legal system to facilitate paternity claims.

Change is slow but hope is consistent.
