



A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

My Dear Friends in Christ,

I would be willing to bet that for most of us, our first experience of "saving" was a "piggy bank". It was in this way that we



put away, little by little, our hard earned allowance, birthday money or the like, saving it for something really special or that proverbial "rainy day". If you're also like me, you got impatient at times and broke into that repository, splurging on something you "just had to have". The object lesson in all of this (and in today's gospel) is that there is a difference between "saving" and "hoarding".

In today's gospel, three servants are given "talents" (a coin which had varying amounts of worth, depending on the material of which it was made; presumably, the three servant's talents were of the same value, albeit varying amounts). One is given five talents, one is given three, the third given one; the first two subsequently invested them, the third buried his one talent (given today's economy, he might be seen by us as the wisest one!). In this way, the third servant wasted his charge. He chose not to risk the talent given, something inherent in investing. This sense of risk is also something inherent in discipleship, for following Christ involves risk. One risks losing friends, even family; one may even risk their life, given the situation.

When the master returns, he praises the two servants who invested (albeit with the known risks), and takes away the one talent from the third servant. The servant attempts to justify his action by putting the onus on the master – bad move! The master takes offense at this because his actions and motivations notwithstanding, the servant still failed to take that "leap of faith" necessary in investing (read: discipleship). We do not plant, yet we are called to harvest; we did not scatter, yet we are called to gather. At the very least (taking the gospel as a metaphor for discipleship), we are called to at least attempt to bring some "return on investment" – the investment God has made in us.

What "talents" (using now the modern understanding of the word) do we have, have we been given by God? Are we "burying" these gifts by failing to trust in God's plan for us? Are we fearful of reprisal, rebuttal or retribution? We should not fear what the world can do to us, for the world holds no power over us (only the power we might choose to give it). May we have the courage of that "worthy wife" (Prv 31:10) spoken of in our first reading, reaching out to the poor and needy while trusting in God's plan for us. May we, as Paul speaks of in our second reading, be "alert and sober" (1 Thes 5:6), ready to answer the Master's call, no matter when it may come!

November Teen Mass



MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

Today's gospel speaks of the "Parable of the Talents". One might not realize that a "talent" as spoken of by Jesus in this gospel parable was an actual thing, a unit of currency. In terms of currency, a talent was worth 60 minas. 1 mina was worth 100 denarii. 1 denarius was the equivalent of a day's wages. So a talent was 6000 days' wages, or the equivalent of more than 16 years' earnings! So the man who had five talents basically had a lifetime of wages entrusted to him. This is important to realize when looking at the gospel, and important when looking at St. Francis.

St. Francis was a man of many talents, which are natural gifts that we think of when speaking of "talents". Along with his natural charm, he was a gifted horseman and archer. These would suit him well in terms of his pursuit of his seeking knighthood. Little did he know that these talents would be of little use when pursuing a relationship with God, after his conversion. His natural charm, however, would be of great use when seeking to establish the Franciscan Order. Being a "man of the world", he knew how to deal with the worldly and the things that were important to them. He could speak to both king and commoner with equal aplomb. But it was his ability to discern when to "turn on the charm" and when to be "Il Poverello" (the "Little Poor One") that was perhaps his greatest gift. His humility was genuine, as it was a recognition of his standing with God, but it also was of great use when seeking approval of, and later contributions to, the Franciscan Order.

These "talents" were also not unlike the talents spoken of in today's gospel, for the many talents which St. Francis had were meant to be used over a lifetime, much like the man who was entrusted with five talents (a lifetime of wages). It was meant to be "invested" (literally, in the case of the gospel), to bear fruit for the master who gave his servant these talents. St. Francis, after his conversion, invested wisely and well to bear much fruit for the Order and for the Church Universal.

May the talents of St. Francis, given over time and used over a lifetime, be ours as well: namely, poverty (of spirit), humility, and love for all God's creatures (great and small, human and animal). May we come to know the life St. Francis had, a life lived in union with God here on earth and (please, God) in the Kingdom to come.
