My Dear Friends in Christ,

With Thanksgiving upcoming later this week, and the "Christmas Rush" fast on Thanksgiving's heels (although for many the rush has been long underway, but that's another story!) we "wrap up" another Church year, as we work on a bit of a different calendar. Today, the Church celebrates The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe – more commonly known as "The Solemnity of Christ the King". In this feast, we end the liturgical year and move on to Advent, the time of preparation for Christmas (Day and Season). As I say, we "march to a different drummer" in the Church!

On the Solemnity of Christ the King, we recognize Jesus as Sovereign Lord, one who rules not from an earthly throne but within a celestial Kingdom. Jesus' reign is one of eternal dimensions, something which eludes the leaders of the day, including Pilate. Jesus, in His encounter with Pilate, establishes His Kingship as being one which "does not belong to this world" (Jn 18:36). The dialogue with Pilate takes many "twists and turns", covering topics such as authority, leadership and truth. In this meeting with Pilate, which takes place on Good Friday, Jesus for the last time makes His point that His message and mission hasn't been about this world (except to save it) but about the world to come in God's Eternal Kingdom. Much of this is lost on Pilate, except for the fact that he knows that he doesn't want to get involved (thus "washing his hands" of the whole affair when he hands Jesus over to the crowd). Jesus, I suspect, is the type of leader that Pilate wishes he could be – strong, sure, confident in His mission and message. In truth, Jesus is the type of leader that every leader should strive to be like!

As we conclude this church year, we look forward more than look back. We look forward to Advent, the great season of preparation for Christ at Christmas and as King of Heaven and Earth. We look forward to Christmas, when Christ is born to us once again in time, and for all time. We look forward to a new calendar year, a year filled (no doubt) with challenge, hope and promise. May Christ the King come to rule your heart so that all good gifts might be yours. May Christ the King come to rule our world so that it may be more a place of hope and promise. May Christ the King come to rule our Church so that it may be a solace in troubled times and a light to the nations. May Christ the King come!

#### *St. Joseph, Patron for the Dying and Terror of Demons*

A number of years ago while

serving at daily Mass at Bishop Connolly High School, I was introduced to to St. Margaret Mary Alocoque (1647-1690) and her devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. I was moved to hear the promise the Lord made to all of us through this Holy Saint: "I promise you in the excessive mercy of My Heart that My all-powerful love will grant all to those who communicate on the First Friday in nine consecutive months the grace of final penitence; they shall not die in My disgrace nor

without receiving their sacraments; My Divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment."

A year ago, I was reminded of this Great Promise. Many know that my mother died just over a year ago. In her final days she called out to me—not only as her son, but as a deacon—to arrange for a priest to come to the house and give her the final sacraments. Fr. Paul made the time to come to the house, hear her confession, anoint her, and invite me to give her viaticum. As I witnessed the movement of grace in her final days, I thought to myself that as a young girl growing up in West Roxbury at St. Theresa's Parish, she observed the First Friday Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and was now receiving the fruit of the final and Great Promise that Christ and his Church would be by her bedside as she passed from this life to the next. My mom experienced a happy death.

In the Litany of St. Joseph, we pray, "St. Joseph, Patron of the Dying, Pray for Us." Not much, if anything, is known about St. Joseph's death. We presume that he died as most people do, in their homes surrounded by loved ones. This image gives me great hope because St. Joseph was surrounded by the Blessed Mother and Jesus—wrapped up in their loving arms.

St. Joseph is a great teacher and model of the faith. He teaches us how to be faithful, obedient, and hard working. He teaches us how to love "from the shadows". He teaches us how to place our trust and hope in God. He teaches us how to care for those entrusted to us. Perhaps his death teaches us the greatest lesson—to place ourselves amid Mary and Jesus and allow Mary's intercession and Jesus' mercy to bring us pardon and peace.

Our experience tells us that death can also be a terrifying time for the dying and for their loved ones. Here again, we can turn to St. Joseph and pray for a happy and peaceful death by calling out to him, as his litany invites us to do, under the title, "Terror of Demons." By reaching out to St. Joseph in this way, he comes to our help to calm our spirits and to ward off any evil spirits who seek to rob us of our hope in the promises of his son and our Lord, Jesus Christ.

My friends, I invite you to develop a relationship with St. Joseph, Patron of the Dying and Terror of Demons. As you put your head down to sleep pray to God, through the intercession of St. Joseph, that when your time comes to pass from this world to the next you will be surrounded by the love and prayers of Mary and the love and mercy of Jesus.

## <u>St Ann's Parish Center Renovation Fund</u> <u>and Religious Education Update</u>

I would like to update all of you on the Renovation Project and the opening of the Religious Ed Program. I have both good news and bad news to share.

I will give you the bad news first. We have completed our negotiations with the contractors and unfortunately at this time we are not able to start the renovations. The original contractor that we hired had agreed to give us payment terms of net 6 months. Therefore, we were going to be able to do the renovation and pay for it within 6 months' time. However, the new contractor was not able to offer us the same terms. We would have needed to pay, net 30 days, which is not possible for us to do. Therefore, we will now need to raise the money prior to starting the work. We will be doing many fundraising activities over the next few months to pay for the renovations. We thank you in advance for your support of our fundraising activities.

Next, the good news. We will be able to have our Religious Ed Classes for Grades 1-8 at St John's, starting the first weekend of December. When we were initially analyzing our facilities, there were some concerns regarding St John's Hall, which prohibited us from being able to open the hall. I am happy to say that these issues have been resolved so we are now focusing our efforts into being able to open the hall by the first weekend of December to be able to have Religious Ed classes in the hall. We will be purchasing the air filtration systems for St John's hall and for both of the churches.

We will spend the next few weeks working on St. John's hall to be able to open it on time for class. There are many volunteer opportunities regarding getting the hall ready. We need people to help us paint and we need people to help us move furniture. If you are able to help with either one of these, we would greatly appreciate the help! 


