




MASSES FOR THE WEEK

My Dear Friends in Christ,

A story is told of the late Cardinal Cushing when he told one of his staff to hold all appointments and calls. When he was asked what they should do if Jesus were to



appear at the door, his response (reportedly) was: "Look busy!" Today the Church begins its Advent journey under the banner of "watchfulness". This is challenging when all around us, people are distracted by the sights and sounds of Christmas. Perhaps you've felt that "pull" yourself and even given into it. If this is the case, no worries! Our Church gives us a four week Season in which to prepare for the coming of the Christ Child in the proper way.

As we enter into Advent, we "begin at the end", so to speak. Jesus, in today's gospel, is speaking of the end times, using the image of the master returning home, perhaps at a time that might catch us unaware. This image is appropriate to our Advent journey, for Advent is a time of "two-fold waiting" – waiting for the Christ Child, born from the line of David, and the waiting for Jesus as the King of Glory who calls us home to fullness of life in the Kingdom (of Heaven). This waiting can be, for many, a test of faith (and patience, if you are of a certain youthful age, waiting for Christmas to arrive!). We want to go to heaven, but we also want to live life to the fullest here on earth. The thing to remember about our lives on earth is that they are but a foretaste and promise of what awaits us in the Kingdom. We can wait (as is evidenced in today's gospel), but we should be ready, here and now, for Jesus' call to join Him for all eternity. This is the sum of the "two-fold waiting".

Advent may seem like the "same old, same old". After all, it comes at relatively the same time of year, has many of the same "themes" ("watch". "wait", "be vigilant") and ends up with the same "goal" (namely, to be ready to welcome Jesus as the Christ Child and the King of Glory). We would do well to not fall into the same routines. I would invite us to try something different, to move out of our "comfort zone". If you haven't followed an Advent calendar, try it this year by following the daily readings and prayers. If you haven't made/kept an Advent wreath for your home, now's the time. I would further encourage you to WAIT. It's easy enough to get "caught up" in the hullabaloo of the preparations for Christmas. These are important and need to be tended to, but not at the expense of our peace of mind or our sanity. So many of us "go overboard" with Christmas and its preparations that they fail to see the opportunity that Advent gives us to "pace ourselves" in these four weeks.

May we take this time of the Advent Season to prepare ourselves, spiritually, for the coming of Christ. Whether it is Christ's coming as the Christ Child or as the King of Glory, may Christ find us ready to welcome Him into our hearts, our homes, and our world. May we give Christ His due, giving Jesus the well-deserved welcome that we would a King. Jesus is our King, enrobed not in a royal garment, but in ordinary swaddling clothes. May we go to the manger in a few weeks, having spent this time preparing for that moment in salvation history when "God so loved the world that He gave us His Only Begotten Son" (Jn 3:16).



MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

Today our Church begins its Advent journey, a four week period of preparation for the two-fold coming of Christ: the coming as the Christ Child (which happens in four short weeks) and the coming of Christ as the King of Glory (which will happen at the end of ALL time). St. Francis felt that Christmas was the preeminent holy day in the Church (even if the Church would disagree, putting Easter at the "top of the list"). St. Francis felt this way because of the Incarnation, the coming of God in Christ Jesus in human appearance. St. Francis felt that without the Incarnation, the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Christ could not have happened. This "incarnational theology" has found a home with many Catholic theologians and scholars.

While it is true that God became human to save humanity from sin and eternal death, this is but one dimension of the mystery of the incarnation. Our theology, and hence our spirituality, tends so often to reduce the total mystery of the Christ-event to the final acts of Christ's life – his death and resurrection. However, the salvation of the human person, and indeed of all creation, begins at the incarnation, in the ontological reality of God entering into the world, into history, and into the human condition. Salvation is first encountered in the very fact of the coming into being of Jesus Christ, God incarnate. And the reality of salvation begins to unfold in the existential reality of Christ's life: his attitudes and relationships, his teaching and ministry, and the values he embodies in all this. Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection occur within and as a consequence of his life-praxis.

In the incarnation, Jesus of Nazareth is God's answer to every question we have about ourselves. When we speak about Jesus coming to teach and show us how to be human we do not simply mean this in its extrinsic and practical aspects. We mean it in a way that goes beyond the behavioral and imitative, but into the existential and transformational meaning of what it means to be a human person. While we certainly do learn from Jesus how to be compassionate and forgiving, just and peaceful, it is in his very being that we begin to discover the truth of our being. Our identity is to be found in his identity, and the truth of who we are before God is discovered in him. In the incarnation, God comes to meet us in our humanity. Those who seek God will not find him by trying to escape their humanity or human experience. God is not to be found in some distant and abstract ethereal realm far-removed from the messiness of human life; God is to be found through a generous embracing of our humanity and by entering more deeply into our human experience. When we begin to understand this, we begin to understand the mystery of Christ. When we come to some understanding of the mystery of Christ present in our own humanity we begin to glimpse the meaning of our existence and the purpose of our lives.

May this Advent be time when we discover who Jesus is by our own exploration of our own being. May Advent bring about the discovery that as Jesus shares His humanity with us, we have the opportunity to share in the divinity of Christ. A Blessed Advent Season to you all!
