

My Dear Friends in Christ,

Today the Church celebrates the Third Sunday of Advent. It has a particular name, Gaudete Sunday. "Gaudete" comes from the Latin, and it means "Rejoice".



We "rejoice" on this Sunday because we are that much closer to the Christmas celebration. Today's celebration gives us a bit of a "breather", a chance to "take stock" as to where we are in our Advent journey and preparations.

Once again, John the Baptist is highlighted in the gospel. In the passage from Luke's gospel, John has just "dressed down" the crowds that came out to see him. John was certainly different than any prophet that had come before, but he was no "sideshow attraction". His words were sharp, and so was his prophetic vision. He knew that people were "sizing him up" to see if, perhaps, he could be the Messiah. In giving the people a "blueprint" on how they were to conduct themselves, he did not make it easy on them. John knew that the teaching of the Messiah would be tough to take, so he (like a good messenger) was preparing the crowd for Jesus. John also knew that if they could follow him, they could follow Jesus.

John's words are so powerful, in fact, that the "buzz" was going around that John might be the Messiah. It is understandable that people might think John was the Messiah, because his words have a power and attraction that few, if any, prophets have brought. The idea that John is the Messiah is not a farfetched one, just an incorrect one. John puts this notion to rest, however, and with strong words. In calling himself "not worthy to loosen the thongs of his (Jesus') sandals" (Lk 3:16), he places himself at the service of Jesus and His message. The message that Jesus will speak will bring about repentance and healing, for the message that Jesus will bring will bear the mark of the Messiah.

Let us truly "rejoice" in the fact that God loves His people so much that He sent us a messenger such a John the Baptist. Let us "rejoice" in the "wake-up call" that John gives us this day, one that makes us aware that we must prepare with all our hearts for the coming of the Lord. Let us "rejoice" that our Messiah will soon be with us, as the Christ Child and the King of Glory. Let us be ready for the coming of the Lord by looking into our hearts and clearing out the "spiritual deadwood", those things that are not of God, and putting into our hearts the good things that God wants for us – the gifts of faith, hope, and love.

#### **MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY**

Like John the Baptist, from whom we hear in today's gospel, St. Francis was one who would give practical advice. Francis encouraged his followers to be (as I like to say) "*in* the world while not *of* the world". One of the most famous quotes attributed to St. Francis, although there is much question as to whether or not he actually said it, is that one should "preach the gospel always and, when necessary, use words".

This Sunday our Church celebrates, on this Third Sunday of Advent, "Gaudete' Sunday". The word "Gaudete" means "Rejoice". We show rejoicing by lighting the rose-colored candle and wearing rose-colored vestments. Another way to look at rejoicing is to offer the world "peace". When we offer peace, we do so as Christ did, by giving of oneself unconditionally. You may have noticed that I sign off on each column with "Pax et Bonum" ("Peace and All Good"). This is a traditional salutation offered by Franciscans of all stripes. St. Francis looked at peace by challenging his followers to be "instruments of peace". The "Prayer of St. Francis" is one which is a "blueprint" for this way of peace. In offering it here, I would call on us to reflect on how we can be that "instrument of peace" that Francis encouraged us to be. Here, now, is that prayer for your reflection:

#### PEACE PRAYER OF ST. FRANCIS

LORD, MAKE ME AN INSTRUMENT OF YOUR PEACE:

WHERE THERE IS HATRED, LET ME SOW LOVE; WHERE THERE IS INJURY, PARDON; WHERE THERE IS DOUBT, FAITH; WHERE THERE IS DESPAIR, HOPE; WHERE THERE IS DARKNESS, LIGHT; WHERE THERE IS SADNESS, JOY.

O DIVINE MASTER, GRANT THAT I MAY NOT SO MUCH SEEK TO BE CONSOLED AS TO CONSOLE, TO BE UNDERSTOOD AS TO UNDERSTAND, TO BE LOVED AS TO LOVE. FOR IT IS IN GIVING THAT WE RECEIVE, IT IS IN PARDONING THAT WE ARE PARDONED, AND IT IS IN DYING THAT WE ARE BORN TO ETERNAL LIFE. AMEN.

May we rejoice with the Lord, always, by being instruments of His Peace! A Blessed Gaudete Sunday to you all!

#### THE DEACON'S COLUMN

#### Feasts and Traditions honoring St. Joseph

On Wednesday, December 8<sup>th</sup>, on the Feast Honoring the Immaculate Conception of Mary, the Church concluded the "Year of St. Joseph." Most people are familiar with some of the major Marian Feast Days honoring the Blessed Mother and the apparitions she has made over the course of history. But some may be surprised to learn that in some of these apparitions, St. Joseph, appears with his Blessed Wife.

On May 13<sup>th</sup> the Church remembers the apparition at Fatima to three children. Sr. Lucia wrote in her diary that on October 13<sup>th</sup>, as promised, the Blessed Mother appeared and there was the Miracle of the Dancing Sun. St. Lucia also writes that next to Mary was St. Joseph holding the Child Jesus with his hand extended in a blessing. When families are facing particular struggles they are invited to turn to the Holy Family of Fatima and ask for their intercession and grace to be with them in hope.

On August 21<sup>st</sup> the Church celebrates Our Lady of Knock. During this apparition in County Mayo, Ireland, St. Joseph appeared to the right of the Blessed Mother, looking at his Blessed Wife with loving devotion and respect. Though no word was spoken, there was a cloud of light and peace that covered the area and continues to draw people to its site 150 years later. St. Joseph of Knock invites us to turn to Mary and ask for her intercession.

On May 1, the Church honors St. Joseph under the title, "St. Joseph the Worker." This widely known feast day was added by Pope Pius XII in 1955 to counter the Communist celebration of workers on the first of May (May Day). By honoring St. Joseph the Worker on May 1<sup>st</sup> the Church invites us to reflect on the Dignity of Work and its place in God's salvific Plan.

On March 19<sup>th</sup>, the Church celebrates and honors St. Joseph as a Solemnity. A Solemnity is the highest ranking "feast" day and is celebrated by the Church with all the pomp and celebration of a Sunday. St. Joseph's Day usually falls during the season of Lent but because it is a solemnity the Lenten laws of fasting and abstinence are suspended. In Italy (particularly in Sicily), this day is also Father's Day. It is tradition to make cream filled pastry called zeppoles. Another tradition is to set up a "St. Joseph's Table" where the Table is decorated with homemade pastry and breads. The tradition is a communal celebration and reminds families of the bonds of family and the need to care for the poor.

The Church has dedicated every Wednesday to St. Joseph. Make it part of your prayer life, even if it is just on Wednesdays, to ask for St. Joseph's intercession and perhaps pray his litany. St. Joseph, Pillar of Families and Patron of Workers, Pray for Us.




