

PLEAE HELP.

My Dear Friends in Christ,

Are all of your presents purchased and wrapped? Are all of your cards sent? Are you prepared to meet the Lord for your trip to Heaven? What's that? You weren't thinking of that? Well, truth be told, most folks aren't, but the thing is



that is part of Advent and it's something about which we need to think – not only at Advent, of course, but at all times. Our Advent Season is a time of preparation, one in which we ready ourselves for the coming of the Lord at Christmas AND at the end of ALL TIME. This two-fold waiting time is one which happens simultaneously, for while we know the time of Christmas we do not know the day or the hour of the arrival of the Lord at His Second Coming.

Mary is a key figure in all of this, and in today's gospel we hear of her encounter with the angel Gabriel. Mary is told of how she will play a key part in salvation history. I'm sure she wasn't thinking of that when speaking to Gabriel, but her conversation reveals so much about her, her role in the life of Jesus, the world and salvation. She was in the process of marrying Joseph when Gabriel appears to her and reveals that not only is she pregnant, but she is to bear a son...THE SON...THE SON OF GOD. As you can imagine, this comes as a great shock to her since she is not yet married to Joseph and so pregnancy wasn't exactly on her mind when Gabriel appears to her. Furthermore, phrases like "full of grace" (Luke 1:28) and "you have found favor with God" (Luke 1:30) are ones which are heavy-laden with great meaning, great importance not only for her but also you and me. To be "full of grace" (Luke 1:28) means that she has been set aside for an important role in God's plan for His people; to have "found favor with God" (Luke 1:30) means that she has a special place in the mind and heart of God. These are phrases that are rarely used, and should cause us to look upon Mary as someone who has something to say to the Church and to us. Finally, Mary's humility ("Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord, may it be done to me according to your word" shows to us what true discipleship is and places her in a unique place in the Church and in God's plan of salvation for His people.

As we stand on the threshold of Christmas, let us not lose sight of the fact that we must also prepare to meet the Lord in His role as the King of Heaven and Earth, the King of All Creation. May we be as ready (if not more so) for the Second Coming as we are for the First. May Mary, the Mother of God and Our Mother, stand before us as an example of faith and grace, and an intercessor for each one of our prayerful intentions so that she may present them to her Son, the Messiah and Savior of the world. May God continue to prepare us for reception of the Son, and through the power of the Holy Spirit may we be ready when He comes in glory to take us home to our Eternal Reward in Heaven.

Full of Joy

Last year we waited much too long to buy our Christmas trees. We usually have one in the living room and then one by the large window in our room that sits at the front of the house. Essentially, there is one for us to see and then one for all the neighbors walking their dogs in the December cold. If you wait too long to buy a fresh tree you might just not find a tree. But last year I found one tree lot I had not bought from in the past. Luckily, they had some great trees. The price was a little higher than I was used to, but a tree would be mine no matter what.

What I found interesting at the lot was a group of about nine young people sitting around a fire, laughing and drinking coffee. I wondered, "All of these people for a tree lot late at night and this late in the season?" What I found out was that these weren't paid workers. These were recovering drug and alcohol addicts. This was their rehab's tree lot, and this was their service and group therapy. I spoke to a couple of them and found they were the nicest people around. They were full of joy for the new life they had found and thankful for the people who helped bring them through the trial of their lives. Suddenly, that tree they sold me seemed more beautiful and majestic than it had when I first drove up.

This Christmas may the Lord that slept in a manger provide for your rest. May the God that gives many gifts to all of us bless you abundantly. And may the Prince of Peace help you to find true gratitude for the gift of life. May you and yours feel the joy of the season, like a group of recovering addicts around a campfire on a cold December night.



"Say No to ROE"

The state legislature has extended the session until January 5th, 2021. Please remind the members of the Joint Committee on Judiciary that you oppose the expansion of abortion in Massachusetts. Please call the Committee at 617-722-2396 and let them know you are **opposed** to H3320 and S1209 – the ROE legislation. Every telephone call helps! Remember these bills would remove:

- The requirement that young girls obtain consent before an abortion
- The requirement that efforts be made to save a living baby who survives abortion
- The requirement that late term abortions be performed in hospitals
- The bills would allow abortion on demand for all nine months of pregnancy.


