My Dear Friends in Christ,

Today's celebration, the

"Feast of the Presentation of the Lord", has many names. Along with the aforementioned, it is also known as the "Feast of the Purification of Mary", the "Feast of Candlemas" and the "Feast of the Encounter". These various names recall the many aspects of today's feast, and help us to fully understand the impact of today's feast, situated as it is in Ordinary Time.

It is known as the "Feast of the Purification of Mary" due to the fact that this was the first public appearance of Mary since the birth of Jesus. This is not uncommon even in our own tradition, as up until a few years ago, the mother was considered "unchurched" (or "unclean") and unable to join the congregation until such time as she was "ready" to do so. It is known as the "Feast of Candlemas" as this is the day, traditionally, when candles created for church use are blessed. It is known as the "Feast of the Encounter" as it recounts the presence of Anna and Simeon, who "encounter" the Christ Child as He is presented in the temple.

It is, of course, primarily known as the "Feast of the Presentation" due to the fact that in Jewish religious culture, the first-born son of Jewish parents is "presented" in the temple as an "offering" to God. Jesus, being the first (and only) born to Mary and Joseph is presented to Simeon. Simeon, for his part, offers a prayer to God which is to become known as the "Canticle of Simeon". It is this prayer that is offered in the "Liturgy of the Hours" (the prayer of the Church, offered by priests throughout the day) during Night Prayer (the prayer offered by priests at the end of day). As Jesus is presented in the temple, He not only is presented to Anna and Simeon, but to us as well, as "gift" to the People of God. May we "receive" with the excitement with which Anna and Simeon did. May we come to know the Lord as a "gift" to all of us. May we offer ourselves as "gift" to God, ready to receive our "mission" to build up the People of God and God's Holy Church.

Sandwich Making for Capuchin Mobile <u>Ministries</u>


February 17 at 6:30 pm at St. Ann

MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

Today the Church celebrates the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. This is a feast which focuses on the life of Christ as it is to come. Of particular note are the prayerful thoughts that Simeon offers to Mary with regards to the "future Christ" and how He is "destined for the rise and fall of many in Israel" (Luke 2:34). One might look at St. Francis in much the same way.

If one were to do a study of St. Francis (as many theologians over the years have), one cannot escape the fact that he is known for his "Incarnational Theology", that is the view that God chose to come to earth in bodily form and that our bodies are not "accidental" to our nature but "essential" to who we are as creations of God and, thus, "children of God". St. Francis would likely look at the Feast of the Presentation as an essential element to who Christ was in relation to God's people since He chose to be one like us in all things, save for sin, so that we might be freed from our sinful nature and reclaim our glorious heritage as the ultimate creation of a loving Father.

In the Presentation of the Lord in the temple, Mary and Joseph bring Jesus to the temple as is custom in the Jewish faith, for each first-born male is presented to God as "gift". This, in and of itself, is not unusual. What might be rare, however, is the fact that Jesus is not only the first born but is the ONLY son. A couple would be challenged in this day and age, I would think, to "give" their only son to the Lord as Mary and Joseph did. Pietro and Pica (St. Francis' parents), however, did just that, despite the plans that they had. Destined to follow in his father's footsteps as a merchant, God had other plans for St. Francis. After a stint as a merchant and soldier, St. Francis found his calling as a servant of God and a leader of men who followed in Francis' footsteps to follow God.

On this Feast of the Presentation, may we come to offer ourselves as "gift" to the Lord, presenting ourselves to God to be used as God sees fit, putting ourselves and our needs second to that of God and our brothers and sisters.

The value of stewardship living is difficult to see unless we are experiencing that way of life for ourselves.
