





NOTES FROM THE PASTOR

My Dear Friends in Christ,

A man went out fishing one day and, much to his dismay, caught nothing! Realizing that he couldn't face his wife without at least one fish, he went to the



fish market and approached the counter. He picked out a beautiful fish, and proceeded to ask the "fish monger" to throw him the fish over the counter. When asked why the man would want this, the fisherman replied, "this way, I can honestly tell my wife that I *caught a fish*"!

The disciples who Jesus approaches are fishermen, by trade. In fishing "the Lake of Gennesaret" (Lk 5:1), which is the Greek name for Galilee, they were plying their trade in a fishrich area. The body of water in question is thirteen miles long and seven-and-a-half miles wide and, in Jesus' day, had ten prosperous towns along the coastline. Needless to say, it was a great place to fish and it must have been both frustrating and nerve-wracking for Simon Peter and his mates not to have caught anything. As Jesus approaches, He asks them to put out to sea once more; at first, Peter is skeptical but then gives in to Jesus' request. In doing so, Peter shows his trust in Jesus – a faith that will serve him well in future years. Of course, there is such an abundance of fish that it didn't take Peter long to "get the point": if one trusts in Jesus, there will be an abundance of "riches" - not necessarily material ones, but ones that will serve us well as we work as disciples of the Lord.

The "abundance" miracle that is seen here is repeated many times over in scripture. In Exodus 16, we have the manna in the wilderness; in 1 Kings 17:8-16, we have the widow's never-empty oil jug; just a few weeks ago, we had the wine supplied by Jesus at the wedding at Cana (Jn 2:1-11). In all of these, we see two things at work: 1) God provides for the "human" needs of His people, and 2) they show forth the immense power of God. This particular miracle also shows a few other things. In providing, in a miraculous fashion, for the needs of the disciples, there is *recognition* by the disciples of Jesus' power. There is then a *response* by those disciples of a confession of the unworthiness of these same disciples. Finally, there is an *assurance* of success when we follow God's word.

May we have the courage to recognize God's call for us. May we have the openness to respond to that call for us with our whole hearts. May we be assured that when we do this, we will have an abundance of "riches" – not in the eyes of the world, but in God's eyes.

MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

In today's gospel, Jesus reassures Simon Peter "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men" (Luke 5:10). In this simple but profound statement, Jesus sets the course for St. Peter and the life he will be living. When St. Francis first started out in his formation of the Franciscan Order, I sense that he felt a lot like St. Peter. I'm sure there were many times when St. Francis felt that he would be hard at it, and catch nothing. When one is called to such a radical change of life, such as St. Francis was and those who would become the first followers of St. Francis were, fear is inevitable. One naturally would have the fear of starting something new, the fear of leaving the security of the life they were leading, the fear of the unknown of what lay ahead.

I recently had the opportunity to share my vocational journey with some students at Spellman. I was placed at the "vocation station" and was asked (in part) to share my vocational journey to priesthood. I have shared this story many times, and I always point out the fear I felt in saying "yes" to God's call for me to priesthood. I got over that fear when I was reminded by my first spiritual director that the scriptures mention the phrase "be not afraid" (or some form of that phrase) 365 times...one for each day of the year! It was then that I felt truly sure of my calling.

May we not be afraid to "cast into the deep", as the disciples did before their miraculous catch. May we trust, as St. Francis did, in the Lord's call to vocation given to each of us. May we know that it is the Lord who is calling us, and who will lead us into all truth about our vocations and our lives.

THE CATCH

Mini Reflection: What does it mean to lower your net? It means to listen to God, even when you don't understand Him. It means to keep trying the hard thing that you know is the right thing. It means to keep loving the person who is making life hard on you.

I* love today's Gospel passage, and not just because I love a good fish fry.

I love it because I am Peter. Over and over again, I am Peter, standing here exhausted because I relied on my own abilities, and it got me nowhere. I'm ready to call it quits. I'm ready to say it's too hard. And here comes Jesus, asking me to lower my net. To keep trying.

And I try to talk sense into him. "It's not going to work, God," I insist. "I've been trying."

"You've been trying," Jesus agrees. "But you haven't asked for my help yet."

What does it mean to lower your net? It sounds so simple and so easy, but it takes a great deal of humility and trust. I think I'm the expert on my own life, the captain of my own ship. Peter probably thought so, too — he was the fisherman, after all. Why would a fisherman listen to a carpenter on matters of fishing?

Lowering your net means giving God control and letting yourself be changed by what He chooses to show you.

It means to listen to God's instructions, even when you don't understand them, even when you find them frustrating. It means to keep trying the hard thing that you know is the right thing, even when it hasn't born much fruit. It means to keep loving the person who is making life hard on you, even when all you want to do is give into feelings of bitterness and distrust. If we would only lower our nets, the catch would astound us.
