

My Dear Friends in Christ,



There is an old spiritual titled "What a Friend We Have in Jesus". Could you imagine being a friend of Jesus? I'm not talking about a disciple, apostle or follower of Jesus – we're all called to be that. I'm talking about a friend – someone with whom you "hang out", have over to dinner, someone with whom you play golf or tennis. This is the type of relationship which Martha, Mary and Lazarus had with Jesus. Think back to the gospel passage (Lk 10:38-42) where Martha was busy preparing to host Jesus and Mary just sat there (or seemed to, to the untrained eye), ending with Martha being told that Mary had taken the "better part, and it shall not be taken from her" (Lk 10:42). This was a moment when Jesus showed He was a friend of Martha, Mary and Lazarus. Their friendship was evidenced by the honesty of their words, something friends aren't afraid to do.

The story of the "raising of Lazarus" is one of friendship, both human and spiritual. Jesus gets word that Lazarus is ill. One would think that Jesus, a friend of the trio, would rush right over (or perhaps send one of His disciples in His name). Yet Jesus waits for two days before departing from where He was. This may seem strange, but Jesus assures those around Him that "this illness is not to end in death, but is for the glory of God..." (Jn 11:4). Jesus has already formulated a plan in His mind; He knows exactly what He is going to do, for He knows exactly who He is. Jesus knows He has power over life and death, so He knows that even if Lazarus experiences an earthly death that this particular episode will not end in death.

There is another reality at work here as well. Jesus knows that He has power over life and death because, as He proclaims to Martha, He is "the resurrection and the life" (Jn 11:25). It is in this "vein" that Jesus raises Lazarus from the dead. Jesus isn't concerned about the crowds and their wailing; He isn't concerned about the stench emanating from the tomb; He isn't even concerned about Lazarus being dead. Jesus knows who He is, what He is about and what He is doing at all times. This is a powerful lesson for us. While we don't have power over life and death, we have power (in the form of "free will") to decide how we are to live in this life, and thus how we are to spend Eternal Life. God wants us to be with Him in the Kingdom, sharing Eternal Life, but the choice is ours. We choose God by how we choose to live our lives, either in union with God or with the world. Whatever choices we make, the choice is ours. Let us choose wisely and well, so that we may spend Eternal Life in the Kingdom with God and all the saints in the Heavenly Kingdom.

DEACON'S CORNER — DEACON BRENDAN

Before I share some information about the history of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, let me define the word "Rite" as a set form for celebrating Catholic liturgy in the presence of the worshiping community.

The practice of preparing and welcoming new converts , then primarily Gentiles, to membership of the Christian community began in the time of the apostles. New members were instructed in the teachings of salvation and the belief of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, and of course, they were baptized and welcomed to the table where they shared Eucharist. As time went on, the Catechumenate (RCIA) process developed . Individuals would inquire and be assigned a catechist who would instruct them in the Christian faith . They would have a sponsor as well. During their journey in formation, the Catechumens would periodically be examined to determine their understanding and acceptance of the Gospel message. The process itself suffered setbacks over the centuries because of different reasons. In the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries, there was a resurgence of effort among theologians and pastors to have a more thorough response to those adults who were interested in converting to Catholicism. In 1965 during the second Vatican Council, it was voted overwhelmingly to reinstate and restore the Catechumenate. The bishops mandated that the Rite be implemented in all the parishes in the United States. The content of instruction would be Sacred Scripture and Catholic Doctrine as each relates to the other. Paramount to the instruction would be the overall picture of how God spoke through the prophets and Leaders of the Hebrew people until finally sending. His only Son to redeem all mankind. The Catechumen's progress and understanding would be considered by all involved with the hope of them receiving the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist from the hands of their pastor during the Easter Vigil.

FASTING: Catholics over 18 and up to the beginning of their 60th year are bound to the obligation of fasting. Ash Wednesday (Feb. 14th) and Good Friday (March 30th) are the days of fasting. On these days, only one full meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but, eating between meals in not permitted. Liquids including milk and fruit juices are allowed.

ABSTINENCE: Catholics over 14 years of age are bound to the obligation of abstinence. Abstinence is to be observed on Ash Wednesday, Feb 14 and on all Fridays of Lent. On days of abstinence, meat may not be taken at all.
