

My Dear Friends in Christ,



We are an Easter People, and Alleluia is our song! I want to take this opportunity to wish you and yours a very blessed Easter Day and Season. We tend to forget that Easter is a season, and not just one day on the calendar. In all truth, each day God gives us a "little Easter". Each day is a new opportunity for us to "rise and shine" (even those of us who aren't "morning people"!) and look for ways to serve our God in our brothers and sisters. Each day is a chance to engage in discipleship and to spread the Good News that is the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Mary of Magdala (or Mary Magdalene, as she is more commonly known to us) is given that opportunity on that first Easter Sunday. Mary is given the chance to share the news of the Resurrection, even if she doesn't fully understand what is happening. She approaches the tomb, which is empty, and on seeing the stone rolled away she runs to get Simon Peter and "the other disciple whom Jesus loved" (Jn 20:2) (who biblical scholars have come to identify as John, the "Beloved Disciple").

Here is where "the plot thickens", as writers like to say. On approaching the tomb, John arrives first but does not enter; he waits for Simon Peter to arrive. Why? Mainly because faith (as represented by John) always *precedes* knowledge/authority (as manifested in Simon Peter), but waits for knowledge to *verify* our faith before acting. Our first encounter with Christ – our Baptism - was taken on faith; the actions entailed in the Sacrament were undertaken by our Parents, Godparents and the Clergy who performed the Baptism. We trusted that our parents had our best interest at heart in bringing us to the baptismal font. It wasn't until our Confirmation, when we had the wisdom to do so, that we fully took on our faith for ourselves.

Easter is a season of new possibilities. It gives hope in a brighter tomorrow, even in the midst of challenge and struggle. It helps us to realize that our lives do not end in death if we have faith that Christ's life, death, and resurrection happened so that we might have newness of life. May we celebrate this day and season with a renewed sense of hope in God's promise of Life Everlasting. May we come to the understanding that Jesus Christ has broken the chains of sin and death and won for us the gift of Eternal Life.

# Fools for Christ: Loving Kindly Online

But a tiny spark can set a great forest on fire. And among all the parts of the body, the tongue is a flame of fire. James 3:5-6

Toxic environments take their toll on us mentally, emotionally, psychologically, and even physically. The heaviness, the unending negativity, the spiritual suffocation... A way out or a way through becomes a lost hope as we try to live and love as best we can.

We each can remember a past or present situation that is toxic in this way. I'd like to offer for your reflection a new toxic space that is victimizing all of us unawares. That negative space is created online by trolls, people who purposely or out of habit comment in social media and online news and blog articles with language that is insensitive, emotionally charged, and self-serving. These people's "tongue" is their keyboard through which they anonymously spew out ill-informed remarks that create a cycle of anxiety and shut down the hearts of those who have to read them.

It is the fool who realizes the power of the tongue that can burn down reputations, hopes and dreams, and the heart that lives with the vulnerable loving kindness that is the call of the disciple of Christ. It is the fool with the foolishness of the crucified Master who prays for those they meet online--whether they are virtuous or harmful. It is the wise fool who closes a page that is "on fire" with angry or derogatory comments in order to preserve the joy of spirit that is the blessing of the Holy Spirit. It is the fool that writes and comments with hope, offering readers a ray of light and love.

Such foolishness has its blessing here in a spirit that remains peaceful and trusting in the face of everything, and hereafter "the meek shall inherit the earth" (cf. Matthew 5:5).

What is Easter?

Easter is the celebration of the resurrection of Jesus from the tomb on the third day after his cruxifixion. Easter is the fulfilled prophecy of the Messiah who would be persecuted, die for our sins, and rise on the third day. (Isaiah 53).

#### When did Easter start?

The early Christians began remembering the Resurrection every Sunday following its occurrence. In A.D. 325, the Council of Nicaea set aside a special day just to celebrate the Resurrection. The problem with an official day was deciding whether the Resurrection should be celebrated on a weekday or always on a Sunday.

Many felt that the date should continue to be based on the timing of the Resurrection during Passover. Once Jewish leaders determined the date of Passover each year, Christian leaders could set the date for Easter by figuring three days after Passover. Following this schedule would have meant that Easter would be a different day of the week each year, only falling on a Sunday once in awhile. Others believed since the Lord rose on a Sunday and this day had been set aside as the Lord's Day, this was the only possible day to celebrate His resurrection. As Christianity drew away from Judaism, some were reluctant to base the Christian celebration on the Jewish calendar.

Finally the Council decided Easter should be celebrated on the Sunday following the first full moon after the vernal equinox. Since the date of the vernal equinox changed from year to year, calculating the proper date can be difficult. This is still the method used to determine Easter today, which is why some years we have Easter earlier than other years.
