



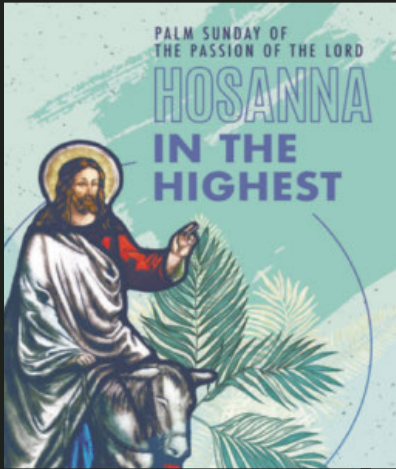

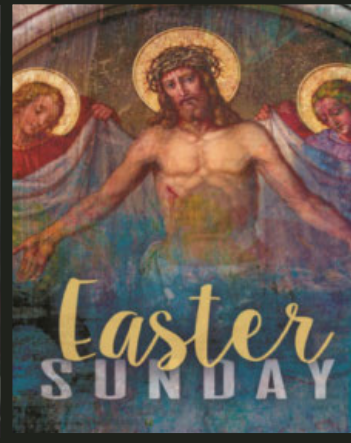
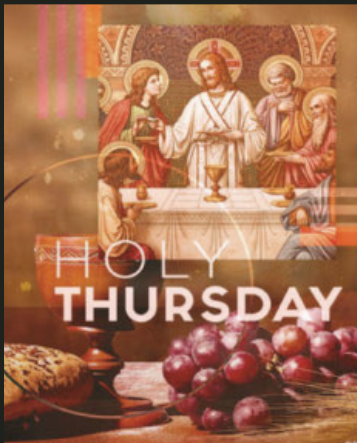

NOTES FROM THE PASTOR

My Dear Friends in Christ,



If someone were to ask you, “what is the holiest day in the Church year”, what would your answer be? Most, I dare say, would answer “Christmas”...and they’d be wrong!

Now, don’t get me wrong – I like Christmas as much as the next person, and as a Secular Franciscan I have “adopted” a particular viewpoint that would put Christmas “on par” with Easter, with its Incarnational (that is, bodily) Theology. However, when looked at liturgically, it is second to Easter, the most sacred day of the Church Year. We begin our “final approach” into Easter (as well as our Holy Week services) with today’s celebration of Palm Sunday of the Lord’s Passion (interchangeably referred to as either “Palm Sunday” or “Passion Sunday” (due to our reading of the Passion Narrative today)).

Today is unique in that two gospel passages are read, one depicting Jesus’ entrance into Jerusalem and one speaking to us of Jesus’ Passion and Death. Both read at today’s liturgy serve as “bookends” to our Holy Week services. The entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem (intoned at the beginning of Mass) speaks of the kingship of Christ, for it is a celebration befitting royalty, with people lining the streets offering shouts of praise and acclamation to Jesus. They recognize Jesus as Messiah at this moment, and pledge their loyalty to Him with shouts of “hosanna” (a word which means “save us” or “help”, an appropriate cry made to Jesus). The interesting thing is that the same crowd who is crying “hosanna” is most likely the same crowd who, in a few short days, will be calling for blood with cries of “crucify him”.

This is where the second gospel (read at the usual time) comes in. It is the telling of the Passion and Death of Jesus, about how He was betrayed and handed over to be killed just a few hours after celebrating the Last Supper (a Passover meal) with His disciples. This depiction of the last hours of Jesus’ earthly life serve as a reminder to us of how much Jesus gave Himself for us, offering His life so as to save ours. The telling of this Passion narrative shows to us that Jesus, He without sin, became sin for us and won for us newness of life. Jesus did all of this without rebelling, without turning back, not shielding Himself from the torture and torment that He knew awaited Him. This is true love, the self-emptying love by which Jesus shows us how we are to act.

May this Passion/Palm Sunday be a fitting time for us to unite ourselves with Jesus. Let us make the long walk to Calvary with Him so that we might have a share in His Passion, Death and, ultimately, Resurrection. May we have the courage to not turn back, to not shy away from all that Jesus suffered, so that we might have a share in new and everlasting life!

Tenebrae

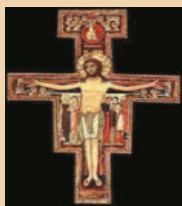
April 15 @ 7 pm St. Ann

MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

Today the Church celebrates Palm Sunday, or “Passion Sunday” as it is sometimes called due to the fact that the Passion Narrative (that is, the story of Jesus’ suffering and deaths which, ultimately, lead to Resurrection). In this narrative, one of the key elements on which we focus is the depth of Jesus’ love for us in allowing Himself to experience the physical suffering that He did, especially the Crucifixion. In this heinous act, Jesus is nailed, hands and feet, to the Cross. When He is taken from the Cross, the wounds remain open until He is readied for burial. There have been some in our faith tradition (including Padre Pio, a Franciscan Capuchin) who have experienced the Stigmata, that is the bodily manifestation of the wounds of Christ – His hands, feet, and side. Most times, the Stigmata is limited to the hands, but there have been occasions when some have experienced the Stigmata on the other parts of the body as well. Francis was one of those people.

St. Francis was, in point of fact, the first person to receive the holy wounds of the stigmata. In 1224, St. Francis and a follower (Brother Leo) were meditating on Christ's suffering during a forty day fast spent in the wilderness of Mount Verna, Francis had a vision of a seraph (a six-winged angel) crucified like Christ. Immediately, there appeared on Francis's body the stigmata, visible marks of the wounds of the crucified Christ that he carried to his grave. So, who does receive the stigmata? Quite simply put, it is a physical manifestation of a desire to imitate Christ in one's dedication of oneself to the poor and suffering. It also shows the special union a stigmatist has with Christ. One need not be a stigmatist to be have an intimate relationship with Jesus, but one who receives the stigmata can most certainly be considered close to Christ. Following Francis, two more Franciscans received the stigmata: Saint (Sr.) Mary Francis of the Five Wounds (in 1731), who received the stigmata internally – that is, she felt the pain of the stigmata without actually bearing the wounds. St. Pio of Pietrelcina (in 1918), affectionately known as “Padre Pio”, bore the wounds of Christ in the stigmata for the final 50 years of his life. Both of these saints showed an incredible love for Christ in bearing these wounds.

I dare say that most all of us will never receive the Stigmata. However, we are still called to unite ourselves to the suffering of Christ by reaching out and uniting ourselves with the poor, the outcast, the marginalized. In doing this, we bear the sufferings of our brothers and sisters – and, thus, of Christ Himself, who came into the world to serve the needs of all. We do this most profoundly when we lend a hand – physically, spiritually, emotionally – to a brother or sister in need. May we enter into this Holy Week by beginning today, with Palm/Passion Sunday, to walk with Christ and remain faithful to Him to the Cross, the grave, and, ultimately, Resurrection at Easter!

APRIL IS NATIONAL CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION MONTH

“It takes a village, or in this case, a parish, to keep our kids safe and stop child abuse. There is no such thing as too many people educated or too many people praying. Everyone who know how to keep kids safe is one more person who is watching and maybe one more child who won’t be abused or will be freed from abuse.

1) **“Did You Know...?Five Steps to Safer Environments**

The Archdiocese of Boston mandates that all people who work with children and youth in our parishes and schools much undergo child abuse prevention training through the VIRTUS program. Come to a Protecting God’s Children training to learn about the warning signs of an inappropriate relationship with a child, and how to help keep all kids sage. The training details five steps to prevent child sexual abuse:

1. Know the warning signs!
2. Control access to children by carefully selecting the adults who work with children and youth.
3. Monitor all programs for the safety of children and youth.
4. Be aware of and sensitive to what is going on in the lives of children.
5. Communicate concerns to the appropriate person in authority.

2) **Did You Know...Child Abuse can occur in every culture and every socio-economic demographic.** Peer reviewed research also indicates the vast majority of child abuse occurs at the hands of someone known to the victim. You can protect children by respecting the safe environment protocols established at youth serving organizations. More importantly, you can implement many of these protocols in your home and be ever observant and vigilant in all public and private settings.
