

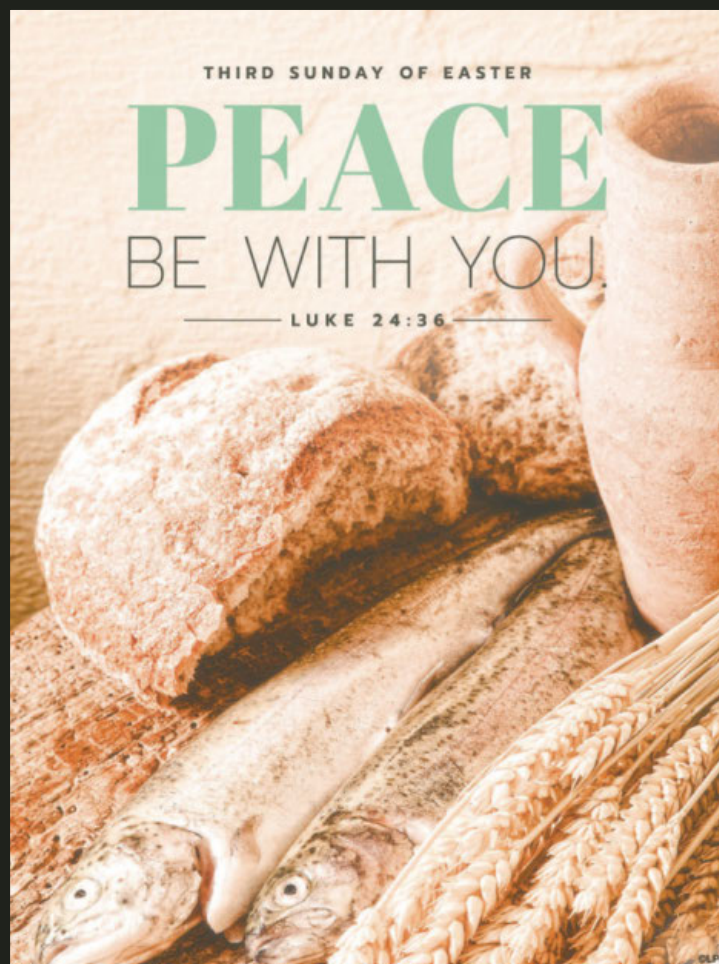

MASSES FOR THE WEEK

My Dear Friends in Christ,



A (continued) blessed Easter to you! I know that for most of the world Easter has come and gone, but for those of us who gather on this day the Easter celebration continues! In today's gospel, we have the passage from Luke which tells of Jesus' encounter with the disciples in the "upper room"; it is mostly likely the same space that they gathered with Jesus for the Last Supper. As we enter into the scene, the apostles are hearing about the two disciples' encounter with Jesus on the road to Emmaus. It is in the "breaking of the bread" (Lk 24:35) that these two come to recognize Jesus, whereupon He vanishes from their sight.

As the apostles are hearing about this post-Resurrection event they have one themselves. As with the other gospel accounts, Jesus' first gesture is to offer them peace. It is a peace that only He can give, for it is a peace that is rooted not in this world, but in the Eternal Kingdom of God's Eternal Peace. He further assists them by allaying their fears, for they think they are encountering a ghost. In showing them His flesh and bones, as well as asking for something to eat, Jesus shows them (and us) His *humanity*, and the fact that there was, indeed, a bodily death and resurrection. He emphasizes this point further by speaking of the prophetic words that were written and spoken about Him.

Easter is a time of new hope, new peace, and new life. The apostles, gathered in the upper room, are sharers and bearers of that new life. They are about to embark on a new way of living and Jesus takes the time to give them some "marching orders". As witnesses to Jesus' death and resurrection, they are now being called to share these truths with others, with the whole world really. This is why "repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem" (Lk 24:47-49). This is the new "job" for the apostles, "ones who are sent" (which is what the word "apostle" means) into the world for the spread of the gospel and the salvation of souls. May we who share in Christ's baptism also share in His death and resurrection. May this sharing bring forth a boldness in word and deed. May we come to know and understand this truth, and share it with all whom we meet.

Sandwich Making for Capuchin Mobile Ministries

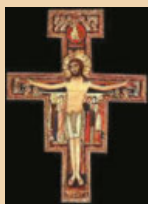

MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

In today's gospel, Jesus offers His disciples the gift of peace. It is a peace that only He can give as it comes not from the world (whose peace is temporary and transitory) but from God's Eternal Kingdom (whose peace is eternal and everlasting). In light of that, I offer you St. Francis' Peace Prayer. It is a "blueprint" on how we (all, not just Franciscans!) are to conduct ourselves in the world. And so, I offer you this:

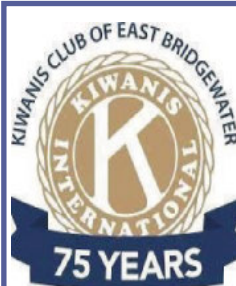
Everyday Stewardship

Answer:

As human beings, we are both spiritual and corporeal. We are body and soul. This makes us unique in all creation. No other physical creature — plant or animal — possesses an immortal soul made in God's image and likeness. Like the distinction with plants and animals, angels have an entirely different sort of existence. Angels are pure immortal spirit, and they have been so since the moment of their creation. While they may take on an appearance of a body in Biblical history, they are not a body like we are. Angels are neither male nor female, despite the art we often see.

As the result of the Fall, human beings experience death. Our souls are temporarily separated from our bodies. However, we do not become something other than human. Every Sunday in the Creed we profess "I believe in the resurrection of the body." As Jesus was united with his body on the third day, so too will we be united with our bodies at the end of time.
