




MASSES FOR THE WEEK

My Dear Friends in Christ,

Pentecost Sunday: the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, the "birthday" of the Church. It is a feast which has multi-denominational roots. It is, in Christian circles, often called



"Whitsunday" (especially in Great Britain); it is historically and symbolically connected to the Jewish harvest festival of Shavuot which commemorates the Lord giving Moses the Ten Commandments on Sinai fifty days after the Exodus event. It is marked for us, as Catholic-Christians, by the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles.

The symbols of Pentecost are multiple, as well. Fire, wind and a dove are all used to connote the fact that the Holy Spirit has power and moves as God wills it. These symbols pale, as symbols do, in comparison to the actual presence of the Holy Spirit. We need these symbols, however, to "wrap our minds around" a concept that is bigger than ourselves. This is why the biblical writers use such symbols – to convey a greater truth than one we could scarcely imagine on our own. This is why we, in the Church, use these symbols of fire, wind and doves – to help us to grow closer in the truth, the truth that God is still at work in our lives. This past week, fifty-two of our young people received the outpouring of the Holy Spirit in the Sacrament of Confirmation. It was at that moment that they were "sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit". A power came into their lives greater than themselves, greater than any of us. This moment was a testament to the fact that the Holy Spirit is alive and well and working in our Church to this day.

The Apostles gathered in the upper room, perhaps the same room in which they gathered for the Last Supper on Holy Thursday. The doors were locked, for they feared the authorities who had the power to end their earthly lives. Jesus, in standing in their midst, gave them His peace, a peace which the world cannot give. It is in the midst of this peace that they now stood, able to go forth from that place and do great things in the name of God. It is in the midst of that peace that we now stand, able to go forth from our places of worship to do great things in the name of God. And let us not kid ourselves – it was no easier for the disciples gathered at that first Pentecost than it is for us. They had challenges to their faith, and we have challenges. They had persecution in the early Church, as do we today. They had the Holy Spirit in their midst...and so do we!

May we have the courage of the early Church to go out to all nations, proclaiming God's truth in love, His victory over sin and death in Christ Jesus. May we know that the Holy Spirit is with us on this day and on every day that we have the opportunity to proclaim the truths of our faith. May we feel the power of the Holy Spirit in our lives, and may we share that power with all whom we meet.

June Sandwiches for Capuchin Mobile Ministries


June 17th at 6:30 pm in St. Ann's Parish Center

MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

In his "Letter to the Faithful", St. Francis writes: "Because I am the servant of all, I am obliged to serve all and to administer the fragrant words of my Lord to them. There-

fore, realizing that I could not visit each one of you personally because of sickness and the weakness of my body, I decided to offer you in this letter and message the words of our Lord Jesus Christ, Who is the Word of the Father, and the words of the Holy Spirit, which are spirit and life."

It is by these words that St. Francis acknowledges the Holy Spirit speaking to him (and to us) as "spirit and life". For St. Francis, this "spirit" is a recognition that it carries out work that we could not do on our own, given our own physical limitations. St. Francis was writing this treatise at a time when his own body was failing him and so he had to rely on the power of the Holy Spirit to do the work which he could not. He acknowledges that it is the Spirit which gives him life, a life he could scarcely imagine before his conversion. The prayer that he offers in the "Letter to the Faithful" recognizes these limitations and his need for the power of the Holy Spirit to give him the wherewithal to complete his (earthly) mission. This prayer (found below) calls upon God's Holy Spirit to allow him to do the work for which he was chosen by God, and acknowledges his reliance on that same Spirit to give him the words to say and the way to say them, so as to be most effective:

Most High,
enlighten the darkness of my heart,
and give me true faith, certain hope,
and perfect charity,
sense and knowledge, Lord,
that I may carry out Your holy and
true command.
Amen

May this same Holy Spirit, given to the Apostles at Pentecost and to St. Francis during his life and work, impel us into the world and allow God to work through us, just as it did St. Francis.

Those of us in ministry love this saying: God doesn't call the equipped. He equips the called.

We all know that sort of queasy feeling we get in the pit of our stomachs when it becomes clear what we're supposed to do, in any situation. It's that feeling of: Oh, no. Not me. Not now. I can't.

We've all got our list of reasons why not, don't we? We do it for everything, from big life problems to small everyday choices. I'm not going to invite my neighbor to church because I don't want to come across as pushy. I'm not going to make amends with my cousin because she'll just walk all over me again. I'm not going to say a Rosary tonight because I'm tired and it'll just stress me out.

However, even if we all put our lists of "reasons why we can't" together, I don't think any of us have reasons quite as valid as the apostles. Their job was to convert the nations — and here they are, a bunch of fishermen who haven't been out of Judea, who speak only their own languages. Were they supposed to preach the Gospel via a particularly compelling game of charades?

But even that big, giant, stop-you-dead-in-your tracks Reason Why We Can't was nothing, because God had a plan. He didn't call a bunch of equipped men. He called them, and He equipped them. Cue the tongues of fire!

God doesn't call us to do His will because we have what it takes. He calls us because He's ready to give us what it takes. Being a good steward is to answer the call of Christ knowing he will provide.

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
