My Dear Friends in Christ,



When I was preparing to receive Confirmation, I chose the name “Stephen” as my Confirmation name, a step in the journey toward the Sacrament which signifies the “change” which takes place in the Confirmandi. When I mentioned this to my sponsor, they remarked how wonderful it was that I had chosen that name. When I asked why, they pointed out that all of my given names (first, middle and (now) Confirmation) were all martyrs. I wasn’t quite sure, at the time, how wonderful this was!


As a teenager, I didn’t necessarily think of martyrdom as a good thing; as I’ve gotten older, I realize that each one of us who live the Christian life is called to be a martyr in some fashion. When one accepts and lives their relationship with Christ, one is called to “die to self” so that Christ might live in us. St. Stephen, widely recognized as the first Christian martyr, saw this union with Christ as something to be striven for, something to be entered into fully. Even his final words in which he commands his spirit to God and forgives his persecutors echo the words and actions of Christ. Stephen remains for the Church a powerful witness and testament to how a life lived in union with Christ can bear great fruit.

As Jesus readies the disciples for their new roles of service and ministry, He prays for both the preacher and those who will receive the Word. Jesus further prays for union between Himself (and the Father) and the disciples. This union will be necessary during those times when they are weary and might lose hope. If they feel that they are alone, that they are doing this by themselves, then they might abandon the cause. If they know, however, that God does not and will not leave them abandoned, then they can do amazing things. This is where we “fit in”. We have, through our Baptism and Confirmation, been given a “commission” to go out and preach and teach, heal and minister. Like those disciples prayed for by Jesus, we, too, have the power of the Spirit at work in our lives. Like those sent forth by Christ, we do so in union with God, sharing in the One Spirit who comes to all who call upon the Spirit for strength, guidance and peace.

There may be times when we think that we are in charge, that we are “calling the shots”. This is a dangerous thing, indeed, because when we lose sight of the fact that we are nothing without God, we run the risk of falling prey to the Evil One. As the old expression goes, “pride goeth before the fall”; it is a sin which has been repeated time and time again. If, however, we realize that with God (and only with God) we can do all things, then we will, indeed, bear great fruit. May we have the courage to strive for union with God in Christ Jesus. May we, through the power of the Holy Spirit, not only call upon but rely on the gifts of the Spirit. May these gifts, freely given out of love for us by God, help us to go out to all the world and tell the Good News, the saving message, that Christ has broken the chains of sin and death and won for us newness of life!

MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

“Are we there yet?”. This was common saying on our family car trips, one that (I’m sure) used to drive my mother up a wall! You would never know it bothered her, however, as her response was always a measured, calm response of

“Soon” (regardless if we were one mile or one hundred miles away from our destination). We can all get impatient when a journey, project, or everyday task seems to take an interminable amount of time.

Over the last three and a half years, I (along with Nancy and Kevin Smith) have been journeying along the “road of formation” towards our Profession to the Secular Franciscan Order. At this writing, we are on the doorstep to that journey, with our Profession happening at the Chapel of Our Savior on June 4, 2022. There have been times when it seemed like we would never get here; truth be told, we’re still not quite “here” yet, but our initial formation is done, the rehearsal is upon us, and we are putting the finishing touches on our Profession Mass. So, for all intents and purposes, “soon” is a true reality!

So, what now? After our Profession on 4 June, we enter into “ongoing formation”. When I was finishing up my seminary formation, and my Ordination Day was approaching, I celebrated the fact that I would never have to sit in another classroom again! Well, that feeling lasted all of about a month when I got a notice about a little something called “continuing education”. Keeping up with social and theological trends was something I had to do if I was to stay “current”, and if I was to be successful in my priestly ministry. I quickly realized that while my formal education was done, there were workshops, seminars, and in-service events which I was expected to attend so as to stay current. The same is true for my educational work as a Secular Franciscan. When I (along with Nancy and Kevin) profess to the Secular Franciscans, we move on to ongoing formation – but this time as full-fledged members of the SFO.

This ongoing formation is a reminder to me that we are, no matter our state in life or our standing in a particular community, life-long learners. We should never stop (nor want to stop) learning, growing, stretching ourselves, and recognizing these ongoing times of formation/education not as obstacles but as opportunities. It is formation exercises such as the ones that the SFO offers that keep us active, current, and engaged in the life of the Order. It is also a reminder that no matter our state in life, we should never stop wanting to “go deeper” into whatever it is we are pursuing. It may be an educational opportunity, it may be a pastoral endeavor, or a personal challenge to grow and stretch that gives us the possibility of knowing, doing, and being MORE THAN what we are now.

May you seek out and find, no matter what state of life you are in, opportunities to grow in wisdom, knowledge, and an abiding passion to be the “best version of yourself” that you can be, that God is calling you to be. May you recognize and seize a passion to be a “life-long learner”. May you be open to God’s call to grow, stretch, and live your best life so that God may reveal His plan for you.
