NOTES FROM THE PASTOR

My Dear Friends in Christ,

When I was preparing to receive Confirmation, I chose the name "Stephen" as my Confirmation name, a step in the journey toward the Sacrament which signifies the "change" which takes place in the Confirmandi. When I

mentioned this to my sponsor, they remarked how wonderful it was that I had chosen that name. When I asked why, they pointed out that all of my given names (first, middle and (now) Confirmation) were all martyrs. I wasn't quite sure, at the time, how wonderful this was!

As a teenager, I didn't necessarily think of martyrdom as a good thing; as I've gotten older, I realize that each one of us who live the Christian life is called to be a martyr in some fashion. When one accepts and lives their relationship with Christ, one is called to "die to self" so that Christ might live in us. St. Stephen, widely recognized as the first Christian martyr, saw this union with Christ as something to be striven for, something to be entered into fully. Even his final words in which he commends his spirit to God and forgives his persecutors echo the words and actions of Christ. Stephen remains for the Church a powerful witness and testament to how a life lived in union with Christ can bear great fruit.

As Jesus readies the disciples for their new roles of service and ministry, He prays for both the preacher and those who will receive the Word. Jesus further prays for union between Himself (and the Father) and the disciples. This union will be necessary during those times when they are weary and might lose hope. If they feel that they are alone, that they are doing this by themselves, then they might abandon the cause. If they know, however, that God does not and will not leave them abandoned, then they can do amazing things. This is where we "fit in". We have, through our Baptism and Confirmation, been given a "commission" to go out and preach and teach, heal and minister. Like those disciples prayed for by Jesus, we, too, have the power of the Spirit at work in our lives. Like those sent forth by Christ, we do so in union with God, sharing in the One Spirit who comes to all who call upon the Spirit for strength, guidance and peace.

There may be times when we think that we are in charge, that we are "calling the shots". This is a dangerous thing, indeed, because when we lose sight of the fact that we are nothing without God, we run the risk of falling prey to the Evil One. As the old expression goes, "pride goeth before the fall"; it is a sin which has been repeated time and time again. If, however, we realize that with God (and only with God) we can do all things, they we will, indeed, bear great fruit. May we have the courage to strive for union with God in Christ Jesus. May we, through the power of the Holy Spirit, not only call upon but rely on the gifts of the Spirit. May these gifts, freely given out of love for us by God, help us to go out to all the world and tell the Good News, the saving message, that Christ has broken the chains of sin and death and won for us newness of life!

One of the most important things we can do is trust in Jesus. Join us for a fun week of games, activities and Bible stories as we learn to grow our faith in Jesus.



MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

In today's gospel Jesus prays for His disciples, asking them to be in union with the Father and to make known the Holy Name of God. We also know that Jesus gave His disciples a way

to pray, namely the Our Father. St. Francis, throughout his ministry gave his friars prayers as well. Here are two of them; may they help you to draw close to the Father.

THE PRAYER SAINT FRANCIS TAUGHT TO HIS BROTHERS

Said on entering a church, or before the Blessed Sacrament or before any Cross. The Source for this prayer is found in The Testament 5 and its context is found in 1Celano 45 where the friars before they had the breviary asked Saint Francis how they should pray. He told them say the Our Father and then he gave them the following prayer.

We adore you, O Christ,
here and in all your churches
throughout the whole world,
and we bless you,
because by your holy cross
you have redeemed the world.

THE PRAYER BEFORE THE CRUCIFIX

Traditionally said before the Crucifix of San Damiano. This brilliant prayer puts the human heart with all its desires at the center of conversion not as one might think today the mind. Then it rightly asks for the three theological virtues. These are not human virtues but Divine virtues which are a pure gift from God. Only then does Saint Francis ask for a "sense and knowledge". In Italian the verb "sentire" to sense, engages all the senses: to feel, hear, see, smell, taste, but there is more here, he is asking for the gifts of the Spirit. He knows that this only comes from, "a spirit of prayer and devotion to which all things must give preference". (before work RB Ch 5:2; before study Ep Ant 2)

Everyday Stewardship

I remember watching part of a college graduation address where the speaker said, "With this degree you are commissioned to go into the world and make a difference." The imagery conjured up in my mind by the use of the word "commissioned" was pretty powerful. I thought about the commissioning of military officers and the responsibility they took on for the lives of their subordinates but also the lives of those they protected. To me the word meant something very serious and solemn. It meant huge responsibility and expectation.

In the Bible, Jesus gives what we call the Great Commission:

"Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you" (Mt 28:19-20a).

The word commission makes this more than a suggestion or a hope. There is an expectation, a responsibility, and a mandate. Of course, did you wake up this morning thinking about how you would fulfill the Great Commission today?

Sharing the faith is not just something we should do; it is something we must do. The key is that you don't need to speak all the time to share. It will be through your life of stewardship that others will be able to see Jesus. By giving of yourself, by always responding to the call, and by surrendering all to God, you will lead others to become Sdisciples, to seek out the sacraments, and to observe his teachings. Yes, responding in full to the Great Commission, great things can happen.


