



## **MASSES FOR THE WEEK**

My Dear Friends in Christ,

One of the most common questions I'm asked is: "Why does God allow people to die?" (or some variation on that question). Death is, indeed, part of the human condition. As one trained in sociology, I can tell you that (statistically) the death rate for the general population as a whole runs at about 100% - eventually, we all gotta go! I say that "tongue in cheek", of course, but the truth is that for all of us our earthly life will end. Thank God for God however, because for us as Christians, death is not the end. As one preface for the Mass of Resurrection (Funeral Mass) states that for one who follows Christ, "life is changed, not ended" and that "when our earthly life ends, we gain an everlasting dwelling place in heaven". What a comfort that is for us! The gift of everlasting life, won for us in the sacrifice of Jesus, is something on which we can rely.

So where does that place the question of death? Why does it happen? Is it just so that we can (God willing) get into heaven? We read in the Book of Wisdom that "God did not make death" (Wis 1:13); death came into the world through the "envy of the devil" (Wis 2:24). It was through the jealousy that Satan felt towards God that death came into the world; we can look at Adam and Eve, Cain and Able and many such biblical references to see how jealousy plays a part in this. We read further in this passage that "they who belong to his (read: Satan's) company experience it" (Wis 2:24). Since we (who follow Christ) do not belong to Satan's company, we do not experience the fullness of death. Our earthly life may end, but our lives do not end. The cessation of this earthly experience does not affect or hinder our entrance into the Kingdom.

Our God is the Living God, so how could someone who is living promote death? It is simply not possible! Therefore, we take comfort in the fact that Jesus, in calling us home to heaven, is calling us to life – Eternal Life! When Jesus, in today's gospel, commands the little girl "Talitha koum" ("Little girl, I say to you, arise!") (Mk 5:41), this is a command for us as well. It is a charge to believe in, to trust in, the Resurrection. We are to believe not only in the Resurrection of Christ, but in the fact that we will share in a like resurrection. May this, indeed, come to pass for all of us. May we never know death, but share in the fullness of life won for us by Christ Jesus!

#### **MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY**



Last weekend, I (along with Nancy and Kevin Smith and Pam and Mark Zamanian (all fellow Franciscans) had the oppor-

tunity to travel to Garrison, NY, to attend/take part in the 60<sup>th</sup> Jubilee of Fr. Ken Cienik, SA (Franciscan Friars of the Atonement). The Friars are the men who staff the Chapel of Our Savior in Brockton. Fr. Ken was the Spiritual Advisor of the Fraternity through which we (myself, Nancy, and Kevin) offered our Profession to the Secular Franciscan Order a little over two years ago.

Fr. Ken was ordained in 1977, and has been Associate Pastor at several US and Canadian parishes and is currently part of the pastoral ministry of the Friars at Chapel of Our Savior in Brockton, Massachusetts. He has directed the vocation ministry of the Franciscan Friars of the Atonement, led the Gravmoor Spiritual Life Center at Graymoor and has been Guardian of St. Paul's Friary at Graymoor. He was associate director of several campus ministries and, Director of the Pre-Theologate program at University of Steubenville in Ohio. He was a military chaplain in 1986 until he retired in 2010 as a Commander in the Chaplain Corps of the United States Navy Reserve, and he served US troops in Iraq during Operation Desert Storm in 1991 and Operation Iraqi Freedom in 2003. He was awarded a meritorious service medal in 2006 from the President. Father Ken received his bachelor's degree in 1972 from Siena College in Loudonville, NY, and he completed graduate studies at Duquesne University and Washington Theological Union.

Along with being a fellow Franciscan, Fr. Ken has become a wonderful example of priesthood for me and a good friend. Please join me in wishing Fr. Ken a joyful 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. Ad Multos Annos, Fr. Ken!


