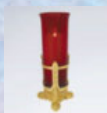

## NOTES FROM THE PASTOR



My Dear Friends in Christ,

Most of you, by now, know my love of bumper stickers. I read them when I am stuck in traffic (which happens far too often than I'd like!), and they help pass the time. Sometimes, the bumper stickers I read make it into a homily or bulletin column (as is the case today). Recently, I read a bumper sticker that read, "If God Had Wanted Us To Be Permissive, He Would Have Given Us 'The Ten 'Suggestions'". I think the point of the sticker is that the Ten Commandments (the item to which the bumper sticker was alluding) are not merely things we *should* do, but that we *must* do (i.e. we are *commanded* to do them).

Jesus, in today's Gospel passage, is asked a question of the law. What is offered is a synthesis of the Commandments (of which there are 613 in the Jewish tradition), namely that you "shall love the Lord, your God with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself" (Lk 10:27). This is a correct answer, but it wasn't enough for the scholar; he felt he needed to justify himself, so he took it further. The scholar asked Jesus who his neighbor was, and this is where it gets interesting.

Jesus, always looking for the hearer/reader of Scripture to grow in faith, takes the letter of the law and moves it beyond, to the spirit of the law. It is in the spirit of the law that one can live out the faith proscribed. In the parable of the Good Samaritan, Jesus shows us what it means to be "neighbor", to go beyond what is expected, and to move into what is desired, by God. God desires us to extend ourselves beyond that which is comfortable. In the parable of the Good Samaritan, the man beaten is approached, first by a priest and then by a Levite. The priest avoids the man because he does not want to be rendered impure; the Levite avoids the man because he has no legal obligation to help and so he doesn't.

It is at this point that the Samaritan comes upon the scene. The Samaritan, being an "outsider" (that is, outside the Jewish Community) has no obligation to help this man...but he does so anyway. Beyond helping the man – by dressing his wounds, placing him on his own animal (thus forcing him to walk beside the injured man), and bringing him to an inn and caring for him – he takes it one step further, by letting the innkeeper know that if there is any further expense, he will take care of it on his way back. Why do all of this, if there is no obligation? Because faith isn't about obligation, it's about expectation – what God expects from us. God calls us to go beyond that which is comfortable, to reach out to those in need out of love, to see Christ in the "other" and to be Christ for them.

May we have the courage to act as the Good Samaritan did, by extending ourselves beyond that which is "comfortable" and do what God wishes us to do: to put our faith into action, to "put our money where our mouth is" by putting our faith into action. May we do this without "counting the cost", for we know that the "price is paid" already – by Jesus Christ, Himself.

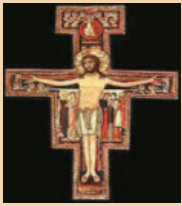

## MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

In today's gospel, Jesus is asked about inheriting eternal life. As a Secular Franciscan, one is called not to fear death, but to embrace it. St. Francis in his "Canticle of the Sun" speaks of this when he refers to our eternal passing by praising "Sister (Bodily) Death". Death is not to be avoided, as it is a natural part of our humanity, but to be welcomed as it is a passing from this world to the Eternal Kingdom. In the passage from the "Canticle", he speaks this way about death:

*Praised be You, my Lord, through our Sister  
Bodily Death,  
from whom no living man can escape.  
Woe to those who die in mortal sin.  
Blessed are those who will find Your most  
holy will,  
for the second death shall do them no  
harm.*

St. Francis in his passing, spoken of in the Franciscan community as the "Transitus" holds no fear of death and even goes so far as to give "marching orders" to his fellow friars when he instructs them thusly: "I have done what is mine to do. May Christ now teach you what you are to do". In essence, he was giving them the resolve to figure it out for themselves.

Each one of us is called to "figure it out" when it comes to life and death as a Christian. May we be like St. Francis and not avoid or fear death, but embrace it as one would embrace a loved one. May our passing be concluded with hearing the words we would all long to hear: "Well done, good and faithful servant...come and share in your Master's joy" (Matthew 25:23).

As you can see, finances at both churches are very tight. We still have the monthly bills to pay.

Fr. always says that your time, talents and tithings help keep the parish going.

We truly appreciate all the help you have given and hope that you understand our situation.

Some of the time and talents that have been donated over the past years are:

Paul Allen and Joe Moriarty have volunteered their time and talent making sure the grass has been mowed at the churches.

Janet DiFalco, Alice Hooper, Mary Langer, & Nancy Wejkovic have educated themselves on how to melt down old Easter candles or the left over altar candles to fill the Sanctuary Candle Bottles. A big savings.

The rectory at St. Ann's has no cleaning service and the staff takes care of some of it as best they can, as well as purchasing items needed when money is tight ie. Paper, paper towels, cleaning items, stamps etc.

Planting the flowers around the church at St. Johns has been volunteers led by Janet DiFalco. Father Francis keeps the prayer garden at St. Ann's full of beautiful flowers

Volunteers help on Monday night making sandwiches for the homeless. Watch Matthew's column for the dates .

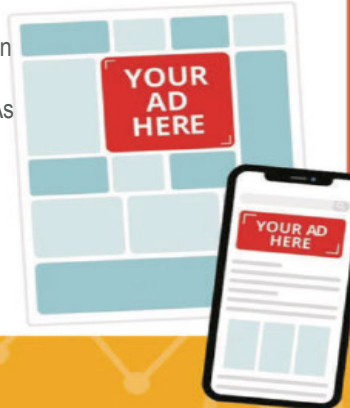

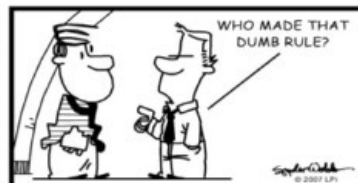
