

“Why Should I Go To Mass Every Day?”

“The Mass is the most perfect form of prayer!”

(Pope Paul VI)

For each Mass we hear with devotion, Our Lord sends a saint to comfort us at death.(revelation of Christ to St. Gertrude the Great)

St Padre Pio, the stigmatic priest, said “Every holy Mass heard with devotion, produces in our souls marvelous effects, abundant spiritual and material graces which we, ourselves, do not know. It is easier for the earth to exist without the sun than without the holy Sacrifice of the Mass.”

St. John Vianney said that if we knew the value of the Mass, we would die of joy.

Your prayers are strongest at the Consecration in Holy Mass (raising of Host and Chalice).

Each time we look at the Most Blessed Sacrament our place in heaven is raised forever (revealed by Our Lord to St. Gertrude the Great.)

“The Holy Mass would be of greater profit if people had it offered in their lifetime, rather than having it celebrated for the relief of their souls after death.” (Pope Benedict XV)

Once St. Teresa of Avila was overwhelmed with God's Goodness and asked Our Lord: “How can I thank you?” Our Lord replied, “ATTEND ONE MASS”.

My Dear Friends in Christ,

The gift of hospitality is a multi-layered one. On one level, there is the act of opening up one's home to family, friends, or strangers (who are usually acquainted with those aforementioned family or friends). On another level, hospitality usually means offering food and/or drink to anyone who comes in. In any event, there is a “burden” put upon the host/hostess when one opens up one's home.

In today's first reading, Abraham has come upon three strangers. Immediately, Abraham offers them all the comforts of home: water, rest, and food. In offering hospitality, Abraham (along with his wife, Sarah) is rewarded with the promise that by that time next year, Abraham and Sarah will be gifted with a son (and they are, their son Isaiah). Hospitality, in this case, has the reward of new life for Abraham and Sarah.

In our gospel passage, Martha and Mary welcome Jesus into their home. In this short, but powerful passage, there is a distinct difference in how Martha and Mary act during Jesus' time with them. Martha is the more “active” of the two, but Mary isn't exactly sitting around doing nothing (despite Martha's protestations to the contrary). Mary has, in fact, “chosen the better part” (Lk 10:42) according to Jesus. This admonition by Jesus isn't meant as a rebuke (although some may take it as such) inasmuch as it is a recognition of the importance of the “ministry of presence” in which Mary finds herself engaged. One of my favorite (and one of the most important) things that I do when I'm in front of the Blessed Sacrament (either in church or in my “home chapel”) is to just “be”...to be in the presence of the Lord, not saying or doing anything, but just “being” in God's presence. Mary's gift of being “present” to the Lord isn't unnoticed and is recognized as that “better part” (ibid); what Martha is doing is important, but Mary's attentiveness to Jesus is more important at this moment.

How do we show hospitality to one another? Are we so busy *doing* that we forget that sometimes just *being* is enough of a gift, often times the best gift of all. May we have the courage to listen to that voice of God that says, “Be still and know that I am God” (Ps 46:10). May we respond to that voice by just being present to one another. May God bless our faithfulness in this “ministry of presence”, and may He reward us with those things that help us to grow in faith, hope, and love.


Everyday Stewardship

When we realize we are going to have company, my family and I swing into motion with a frenzy. No dust shall be present for our guests. The bathrooms will be spotless and toilets worthy of the name "throne." We must run to the store so that an endless supply of refreshments and snacks greet our distinguished guests. We never want to be seen as bad hosts and, of course the real reason for all the commotion, we never want to be seen in our natural habitat of messy rooms and barren kitchens.

But what is real hospitality, a necessity for encouraging good stewardship and developing a sense of belonging? In the Gospel of Luke, Mary knew. Martha was so busy preparing and serving, while Mary simply sat with Jesus and listened to him. This is not to say that she did not prepare for her Guest by making a proper place for gathering. But when a guest is already received, true hospitality begins with being present to and engaging him or her. Part of the message in this story is that we all need to pause and listen to the good news that Jesus preaches, but also we can learn a lesson about good hospitality from it as well.

How many times have we been more concerned with appearances and outward things than what we have inside each of us to share? Christian hospitality calls for the Jesus in me to meet with the Jesus in you. We are called to be fully present to one another, with no distractions of technology or the world standing in our way. This is choosing "the better part." For what does it profit a man if he has all the beer and wine in the world, and a spotless home with the greatest of technology, and loses his attention in the conversation with his brother or sister to the game on television? (Or something like that!)




July 21: Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

This week, please say a special prayer each day for the Poor and forgotten in our parish.


