My Dear Friends in Christ,

You may have heard me compare the difference between involvement and commitment in the analogy of a plate of bacon and eggs. The chicken was involved, the pig was committed! The same is true in the realm of discipleship; when one is a disciple, one is not merely involved – one is committed!

Since becoming the “Together In Christ Collaborative” (of St. John’s and St. Ann’s), we have really started to take a long, hard look at what it means to be a disciple of Jesus. The dedication required goes “above and beyond” what it means to simply “volunteer” for something. When one engages oneself in a life of discipleship, the commitment asked for goes beyond the task at hand; discipleship is more that “getting the job done” – it is engaging in a way of living, a way of life in which God comes first.

Jesus illustrates this point by reminding the listener that God must come first in all that we do, above even family. This can be a hard thing for many, for the commitment to family is important. It cannot be so important, however, that it supersedes the commitment to God. It is from this commitment, this relationship that all other commitments and relationships stem and flow. Jesus further makes the case for committing to discipleship by citing the example of a builder and a king going into battle. Before engaging in either pursuit, one must look at the cost (financially in the first case, availability of soldiers in the second) and ask oneself “is it worth the cost”? If one isn’t ready to “pay the price” (even to the extent of one’s own life), then one must look at whether they are ready to be called a Christian.

This is a “hard line” which Jesus is taking. This is not, as we would say in the seminary, a “warm and fuzzy Jesus”. This is a prophet who is unafraid to speak the hard truth, regardless of whether one wants to hear it or not. This is a messiah who lays out for folks what it takes to be His follower. If one is ready, however, then the rewards are amazing (one might say “out of this world”!)

May we have the courage to both hear and follow Jesus. May we come to know Jesus as Messiah and Lord, calling us to a new way of living. May we strive to follow the teachings of Jesus, and be unafraid to share them with our brothers and sisters. May we put God first in our lives and allow all other relationships be guided by that one. May we trust that God has set the path before us, and may we have the courage to walk that path in faith, hope and love.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

September 8, 2019

23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

It's said that upon reading the Gospels, Gandhi commented that he very much liked Jesus Christ. It was Christ's followers he found troublesome. One wonders who Gandhi had met and if these Christians had truly counted the cost of their faith. Following Jesus, *really* following Jesus, is much more challenging than we may think. He emphasizes this with strong language in this Sunday's Gospel. He compares discipleship to the carrying of one's own execution device — "*his own cross*" — and for the need even to "*hate*" what could disrupt one's commitment. Some of this is standard hyperbole, exaggeration for effect common to the time period. Some of this should make us wonder how deep our discipleship goes.

"Which of you wishing to construct a tower does not first sit down and calculate the cost?" Jesus imagines this construction project gone wrong. Someone may lay the foundation but not have enough resources to finish. We've received the firm foundation of the sacraments — our baptism, for one, along with weekly Mass attendance and regular confession. Yet how often do we find ourselves too distracted, exhausted, or uninterested to truly build our lives on our faith? We have all met such Christians. Some days, we may be those Christians ourselves. We become the incomplete tower that confuses and baffles the onlookers. *"This one began to build but did not have the resources to finish!"*

For some of us, our cross may feel heavier than we expected upon the first lift. Building a tower means laying stone upon stone. It's a process. We don't arrive at completion overnight. Grace is always sufficient to provide the resources, but we need to keep saying yes to the task. This week, consider your own discipleship. What is one area where you've become distracted or discouraged? How can that improve this week? Let God lay another brick on the tower.
