My Dear Friends in Christ,

In the Rite of Baptism, there is an optional “action” under-taken by the priest/deacon in which the “Prayer of Ephphatha” is invoked. It is a prayer in which the celebrant blesses the ears and mouth of the one being baptized, thus readying that person for hearing and speaking God’s word. The word “ephphatha” means “be opened”, and it was used by Jesus to cure the man with the speech impediment.

Jesus, in healing the deaf man, did more than restore the man’s hearing. He brought him “back to life” in a real way, restoring him to fullness of relationship within the community. While the scripture does not say this, it is assumed (given the feelings of the culture of Jesus’ day) that the man born deaf must be a sinner. Sin and sickness were so closely “linked” that the worse the illness/impediment, the worse the sin. The deaf man, therefore, must be a sinner. In healing the man with the impediment, Jesus shows Himself to be the master of sin and sickness, with the ability to break the “chains” of sin and free one who is “bound” in this way.

One of the interesting aspects of this healing comes after it. Jesus orders the healed man (and those around him) not to tell anyone of this healing. Of course, human nature being what it is, the more Jesus tells them not to speak of this healing the more they do so. This “spreading the good news” is human and natural – and Jesus knows it, I think. I believe that Jesus, who knew human nature (being fully human Himself, of course!) knew exactly how people would react; he counted on that reaction to assist Him in sharing God’s healing power.

Where is it that we need healing? Where is it that we have been healed? Who is it among family, friends and neighbors that need to hear the “good news” of God’s goodness to us? May we have the insight to recognize the good God had done for us. May we have the courage to share this good news with all whom we meet!

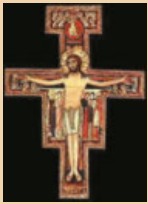

MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

Last week, our nation celebrated Labor Day (in fact we have basically made a “weekend” out of it, since it” unofficially” marks the end of summer for many!). Labor Day traditionally (and somewhat ironically) is a day when workers take a break from their labors and reflect on not only the necessity but the beauty and gift of work. During the time of the pandemic, many people were negatively impacted in their work situation with a number of people losing their jobs and even their businesses. For these folks, Labor Day is seen as a challenging day, especially if they are still out of work. Our nation, however, still marks these days, and our Church also reflects upon the necessity and power of work.

As Franciscans, the idea of work is reflected in the Rule of the Franciscan Order, particularly Article #16, which states that tells us we need to “esteem work both as a gift and as a sharing in the creation, redemption, and service of the human community.” Furthermore, in the Rule of 1223 written for the First Order friars, Saint Francis describes work as a “grace” and warns the brothers against idleness. Francis saw work as a grace and gift from God. We must be receptive to the grace and nurture the gift through prayer and openness to the wisdom of the Holy Spirit. Franciscan spirituality is based in Scripture. St. Francis’ Rule was promulgated to help all Franciscans, Secular and Religious bring “Gospel to life and life to Gospel”. The idea of work and poverty (which is both a Franciscan and Gospel virtue) are linked, as well. Francis’ idea of poverty was to depend totally on God and his own ability to work. Therefore, it was part of the fraternal work of the members to work regularly, and beg only when necessary for enough to keep the members fed and to carry out their work with the poor, especially lepers.

We are here to do God’s work with Christ and Francis as our human role models. You will see most Secular Franciscans wearing the plain Tau cross as a symbol of their profession. Others wear the Tau cross with a hand on each side of the cross. One hand symbolizes Christ’s hand; the other symbolizes the hand of St. Francis. Two years before he died, he also received the Stigmata, the wounds of Christ in his own body. This can be a reminder to us that we are Christ’s hands in the world now and it is up to us to do his work to make his world function and to bring his presence to others.

This Labor Day, let us see work as “grace and gift” not just “burden and bother”. Let us work not only to stave off idleness (which, as they say, is “the Devil’s playground”), but to contribute to the building up of the Body of Christ, the Church. Finally, let us do our work, both physical and spiritual, as a “united front” by bringing “Gospel to life and life to Gospel”.
