My Dear Friends in Christ,



As I was reflecting on today’s gospel, I couldn’t help but think of “A Christmas Carol”, by Charles Dickens. Truly, I was, and I’ll be happy to explain why (even though Christmas is months away). In “A Christmas Carol”, Scrooge is visited by the Three Ghosts (Christmas Past, Christmas Present, and Christmas Future); in today’s gospel, the “rich man” featured in the parable presented by Jesus begs Abraham to call forth someone who has risen from the dead to visit his brothers so that their fate does not “mirror” his. This is where the stories “part company”, for a bit. Abraham realizes that their minds won’t be changed even if someone who has risen from the dead visits them. This is primarily because they (the brothers) have Moses and the prophets to “steer them in the right direction” - they shouldn’t need someone to rise from the dead to “get it”. We know, from the benefit of two thousand years of salvation history, that God did send someone risen from the dead (Jesus, in His post-resurrection encounters with the disciples) to help His followers “get it”. Did they need this? Some did, some didn’t. God realized, however, that something “big” had to happen for people to be convinced of Jesus’ claim that He was the Son of God.

What does/did/will (depending on where we are on our journey of faith) it take for us to “get it”? Was reading the Old Testament, specifically the books of the prophets, enough for us? Was reading the New Testament, specifically the Gospels, enough for us? Were the resurrection (and post-resurrection) accounts enough for us? Are we *still* not convinced that God has a plan for us? Each one of us must answer these questions for ourselves, for our faith journeys are just that – ours; no one else can live them for us. We can (and should) be taught dogmas and doctrines, which provide an important “base” from which our beliefs take root and blossom into action. Eventually, however, if our faith is to be a true and lasting faith which bears fruit, we must come to believe *on our own*, putting our faith into action.

Lazarus was given a share in the Kingdom because God has a special place in His heart (the Church would call it a “preferential option”) for the poor. We must have a similar place in our heart for the poor, including not only the physically poor, but the spiritually impoverished (who may actually be more prevalent in our community). The “rich man” would have had a similar place in God’s Kingdom if he realized how gifted he was, and took the time to share those gifts. God has gifted us similarly. We would do well to take the time – before it is too late – to assess our own “giftedness”, and share these gifts of “time, talent and treasure” with our immediate and biological family, our friends, our family in faith here in the Together In Christ Collaborative, our local communities, our nation and our world.

Who Was Sister Dorothy Stang?

Sister Dorothy Stang and the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur set up a mission in the Brazilian Rainforest, working with more than 100,000 parishioners, preparing them for Sacraments, teaching religion in schools, helping the people with spiritual growth. On weekends, Sister Dorothy and the Sisters would head into rural villages to bring the people together, giving adults religious instructions and training lay catechists. It was during these visits when the reality of oppression and poverty struck Sister Dorothy, and she began teaching the people about their rights as human beings.

Sister Dorothy taught the farmers how to work the land in sustainable ways, without depleting rich natural resources. And she helped the families live in peace and with dignity. Together, they began opening schools in the hills and villages surrounding the farms.

The night before her death she brought food and clothing to a family whose home had been burned to the ground.

For the Extraordinary Missionary Month of October 2019, Pope Francis has asked each country to hold up one missionary witness. In the United States, we have chosen Sister Dorothy.

Dear Parishioners of St. Ann and St. John's, peace.


We would like to complete the girls Dormitory for the following reasons:

Practicing Faith

Question:
I'd like to make some new resolutions about
practicing the faith in our family during the new
year. Do you have any suggestions?

Answer:
The family is the most essential space for the
formation of values and character. Practicing your faith
as a family can happen both internally and externally.
Consistent prayer together builds habits that can last a
lifetime. With younger children, praying together as a
family in the evening or at dinnertime could be fairly
doable most nights. In the evening, select a few
common prayers such as the Our Father, Hail Mary, or
Guardian Angel prayer. Ask each of your children to
thank God for three things that day and include a time
for children and adults alike to pray out loud for special
needs in your family. This practice could be done with
older children, committed to intentional efforts in the
midst of increasingly busy schedules.

Look for other opportunities to practice the faith
outside the home as well. Sunday Mass should
already be part of your family's weekly routine.
Consider setting other monthly goals as well. This
could be a family service project in your city, attending
the sacrament of Confession together, or hosting a
hospitality night in your home. Get your children
involved in the planning process. Ask them where
they'd like to volunteer or who they think is having a
hard time and might need a special night just for them.
Rather than simply imposing new practices, your
whole family can have a dynamic role understanding
and integrating faith and life.
