Prayer of Reliance on God

Oh Lord,

I entrust today's challenges, fears, and uncertainties to You. I don't know how I will do them. I don't know that I can. But I know that You fill the gaps in my ability at every turn. And so, today, I turn to You again.



My Dear Friends in Christ,

When I was in seminary, I wrote a paper for an ethics class (which I was taking over at Boston College) entitled, "Is Being Good, Good Enough?" In the paper I hypothesized that while there was an element of "goodness" in one's life of faith, it was not enough if one was to call themselves a Christian. To be a Christian, I ultimately concluded, meant that one not only must be *good*, but *holy* as well. Holiness was essential to the Christian life because Jesus stated, in scripture, that one was to "be perfect, as my Father in heaven is perfect" (Mt 5:48). This "perfection" comes, I believe, when one is not only good (which anyone can be) but holy (as the Christian is called to be). The holiness for which we are called to strive takes out any ulterior motive, and need for repayment or any desire for glory. Holiness for the Christian comes when one puts their needs, wants and desires second to that of their brothers and sisters.

Jesus establishes this holiness in today's gospel by first eschewing any notion of being good as a virtue in and of itself, shunning any attempt for anyone to call Him "good". Only God is good, Jesus surmises, and the key to Eternal Life is not only following the Commandments but also not relying on the world and its goods. In this way, one can achieve holiness and perfection. This is a challenging edict, especially in our consumerist society. The goal of acquiring as many "goods" (i.e. physical items, that is, not virtues) as possible is key in our society. The old adage, "the one with the most toys at the end, wins", comes to mind here.

Jesus helps the listener to understand how this can be achieved. If on relies on God, for "all things are possible for God" (Mk 10:27), then one can reach this state of holiness, of perfection. This reliance on God, of course, requires a trust on the listener's part. It doesn't just "happen" that one trusts God; it comes over time, over a period of "trial and error" (often times God's "trial" and our "error"!). It was once said (by American humorist Will Rogers) that "good judgment comes from experience, and a lot of that (experience) comes from bad judgment" – how true!

May we have the courage to trust in God so that His light may shine through us. May we come to share that courage by what we do and say in the world. May we always believe that the experiences we have in life – both the good and the bad – can be of benefit for us to achieve not only goodness, but holiness. May this holiness, one day, see us into the Kingdom, sharing Everlasting Life.

MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

In today's gospel, the subject of "evangelical poverty" comes up. When the rich young man in the Gospel of Mark (Mk. 10:17-30) approaches Jesus inquiring about inheriting eternal life, he is told to follow the Commandments - which he is doing. He is then told to "sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come follow me" (Mk. 10:21). He went away crestfallen because he had many possessions and couldn't bear to part with them.

St. Francis was a young man of means, coming from a well off family. His father was a cloth and silk merchant and did well for himself. Because of this wealth, Francis wanted for nothing. As a result, he became somewhat complacent when it came to the needs of others, whether those needs were physical, emotional, or spiritual. He no doubt saw himself as not being reliant on others, even God. One could easily say that Francis was like that young man in the gospel. When he came to his "moment of conversion", he realized that all of this wealth meant nothing when put up against the benefits of evangelical poverty. The idea of not being beholden to the world, of relying on God's grace, was a freeing moment for Francis. It can be a freeing moment for us, as well, when we realize that earthly wealth is nothing as compared to treasures stored up in heaven.

Francis took this idea of "evangelical poverty" and raised it to the level of a spiritual exercise. For Francis, "Lady Poverty", as he came to see this idea of impoverishment, was a concept in which Francis saw himself as a suitor pursuing this personification of perfect poverty for the rest of his life. He would never attain complete fulfillment in this ideal because of earthly constraints, but it did not keep him from wooing and pursuing Lady Poverty. Francis did this by exercising what the Church would come to call a "preferential option for the poor". Francis saw Lady Poverty as symbolic of the poor Christ. She was symbolic of the paradoxes found in the Gospel, especially "richness in poverty". For Francis, Lady Poverty was also a means to the indwelling of God and a way of life that makes present the Kingdom of God here and now.

For the Secular Franciscan, "evangelical poverty" is something for which to be striven and seen in the fact that when we desire Lady Poverty, when we seek to follow in the footsteps of Francis, we see who we truly are as Franciscans. The rich young man would be hard-pressed to be a Secular Franciscan, as would much of the world. For those of us involved in the Secular Franciscans, Lady Poverty is someone with whom we should be intimately acquainted, and someone we should be willing to share with all whom we meet.

How Precious Metal Scams Work

Scammers who perpetrate precious metal scams:

- Create a false sense of urgency by claiming that metals are in limited supply.
- Do not offer the investors the option of possessing what they bought.
- Advise you to liquidate your pre-existing retirement investments to purchase the precious metals.
- Advise you to invest in precious metals through Self-Directed Individual Retirement Accounts.

Tips to protect yourself:

- The US Government and legitimate businesses will never request that you purchase gold or other precious metals.
- Protect your personal information. Never disclose your home address or agree to meet with unknown individuals to deliver cash or precious metals.
- Do not click on unsolicited pop-ups on your computer, links sent via text messages, or email links and attachments.
