

NOTES FROM THE PASTOR

My Dear Friends in Christ,

If I were to ask you what is the "Mother Church" for us as Catholics, you




very well might say "St. Peter's Basilica...and you would be wrong! It is the church which is being remembered and honored this day, St. John Lateran (or the Lateran Basilica). In the year 313 the Roman emperor Constantine published the Edict of Milan, granting religious freedom to Christians. Constantine himself donated the palace of the Lateran, a portion of his wife's dowry, to the Church for its first basilica. The Lateran is the cathedral of the Bishop of Rome, the pope, and, as such, it ranks as the "mother and head of all the churches in the city and the world." From its dedication on this date in 324 until the 15th century, the Lateran was the residence of the popes. Within the interior, towering statues of the twelve apostles bearing the instruments of their martyrdom surround the central nave along the north and south walls.

In my two pilgrimages to Rome, I made sure that I made a stop at St. John Lateran. It is a magnificent structure, certainly worthy of being called "the Mother Church of Christendom". For all of its magnificence and beauty, however, there is a peaceful holiness about it and one can imagine the number of popes who have, throughout the centuries, sat on the "See of Peter". How humbling it must have been to assume such a mantle! I pray that all of our popes, current and future, feel that humility!

When we celebrate a structure such as the Lateran Basilica, one can't help but think of one's own parish church, or the many churches where one has attended Mass for Sunday Mass, for sacramental moments, and for times of peaceful reflection. May we, each time we enter into a church, realize the immensity of God who, at the same time, came to earth and lived as one like ourselves in all ways (save for sin). May we take time today to thank God for this "holy ground" and pray that we may always seek out such places for refuge, for prayer, and for thanks to God for all of His good gifts.

Drawn into the Life of God: The Meaning of the Mass



MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

Back in 2017, on a pilgrimage to Rome and Assisi (where my journey towards entrance into the Secular Franciscan Order began), I had the opportunity to visit the Portiuncula, the small chapel built by St. Francis. It sits within the Basilica of St. Mary of the Angels, and it is dwarfed by the enormity of the basilica. I find this interesting because of St. Francis' simple, humble world view. How odd he must think it, from his view from heaven, seeing his little chapel sitting within this grandiose and gargantuan structure.

Basilicas generally are enormous in structure, befitting their place in our worship. Contrasted with that are structures such as the Portiuncula, serving as a "little brother" to its much larger "big sister" (the Basilica of St. Mary of the Angels). Both edifices, the Portiuncula and the Basilica stand in awe, however, to the Basilica of St. John Lateran in Rome (the focus of our Sunday celebration and feast day today). Sitting as the "Mother Church of Rome" the Lateran Basilica houses the "See of Peter", the seat of the Roman Pontiff, and the center of our faith.

Basilicas and chapels both serve a purpose. Basilicas stand before us and house us, serving as a reminder of the immensity of God. Chapels, much smaller in size and scope, serve and equally important purpose in helping us realize the fact that God desires an intimate, one-on-one experience with us and journey with us on our walk of faith. As we celebrate this Solemnity of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica, let us thank God for all houses of worship that serve as a "touchstone" for us,

Thank you to our cleaners who make sure the churches are spik and span for anything that takes place in the churches.


Thank you to the Choir for their continued effort to make the masses more festive. Please sing out with them. Sing loud and hard, God needs to hear you!


