




Christmas

Q: With Christmas fast approaching, can you give me some practical tips to prepare myself and my family that will help us stay grounded in what this holiday is really about? With all the commercialism, it's easy to stray.

A: Happy times and events bring fond memories and a renewed sense of love and kinship with others. The anticipation is half the joy of the event itself. The coming of the Lord is that kind of event that people have been looking forward to for generations with fervent hope and desire. It gave them strength and courage as they waited for the coming of the Lord.

We know that Christmas is rushed. Sales begin in August and carols blare long before the season begins. Everyone laments the commercial aspects of the season, but as Advent begins, do something to help you be more mindful of the Lord's coming. Use an Advent wreath, or enthrone the Bible prominently, or read the readings from the Bible assigned to each day. Postpone the tree and decorations until closer to Christmas. Establish new family rituals, customs and prayers that help remind everyone that we are preparing to celebrate the birth of Jesus. Fasting, daily Mass, a special celebration of reconciliation, reaching out to those alienated from family or society, and visiting the homebound manifest the love of the Christ Child and the Holy Family.

NOTES FROM THE PASTOR

My Dear Friends in Christ,

Today the Church celebrates the Third
Sunday of Advent. It has a particular name,
Gaudete Sunday. "Gaudete" comes from the Latin, and it
means "Rejoice". We "rejoice" on this Sunday because we
are that much closer to the Christmas celebration. Today's
celebration gives us a bit of a "breather", a chance to "take
stock" as to where we are in our Advent journey and
preparations.

Once again, John the Baptist is highlighted in the gospel. In the passage from Luke's gospel, John has just "dressed down" the crowds that came out to see him. John was certainly different than any prophet that had come before, but he was no "sideshow attraction". His words were sharp, and so was his prophetic vision. He knew that people were "sizing him up" to see if, perhaps, he could be the Messiah. In giving the people a "blueprint" on how they were to conduct themselves, he did not make it easy on them. John knew that the teaching of the Messiah would be tough to take, so he (like a good messenger) was preparing the crowd for Jesus. John also knew that if they could follow him, they could follow Jesus.

John's words are so powerful, in fact, that the "buzz" was going around that John might be the Messiah. It is understandable that people might think John the Messiah, because his words have a power and attraction that few, if any, prophets have brought. The idea that John is the Messiah is not a farfetched one, just an incorrect one. John puts this notion to rest, however, and with strong words. In calling himself "not worthy to loosen the thongs of his (Jesus') sandals" (Lk 3:16), he places himself at the service of Jesus and His message. The message that Jesus will speak will bring about repentance and healing, for the message that Jesus will bring will bear the mark of the Messiah.

Let us truly "rejoice" in the fact that God loves His people so much that He sent us a messenger such a John the Baptist. Let us "rejoice" in the "wake-up call" that John gives us this day, one that makes us aware that we must prepare with all our hearts for the coming of the Lord. Let us "rejoice" that our Messiah will soon be with us, as the Christ Child and the King of Glory. Let us be ready for the coming of the Lord by looking into our hearts and clearing out the "spiritual deadwood", those things that are not of God, and putting into our hearts the good things that God wants for us – the gifts of faith, hope, and love.

A Blessed Continued Advent.

MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

Today the Church celebrates the Third Sunday of Advent. As we find ourselves at around the midpoint of our Advent journey, we celebrate a day known as "Gaudete Sunday". The word "gaudete", taken from the Latin, means "joy" or "rejoicing", and we are joyful and rejoicing that Christmas is almost here, and the Birth of Our Savior, which we celebrate on the 25th of December is right around the corner. St. Francis of Assisi felt, as most Franciscans feel, that Christmas is the most important holy day of the Church year. This may be in conflict with traditional Church teaching (which places Easter above Christmas in the "hierarchy" of holy days) but, as I made mention a couple of weeks ago, a case could be made for this when one looks at Christmas through the "lens" of Gaudete Sunday.

Scripture tells us to "rejoice in the Lord always" (Philippians 4:4)). The "always" of which the writer is speaking is not only in the life to come, but in this life also. He goes on to remind us that while there may be suffering, the end result will be glorious. St. Francis would contend that the Incarnation (the Word made flesh, dwelling among us) is a glorious reminder that our Jesus wanted to share in the fullness of our humanity, and He did so in all things but sin. This is a cause for great joy that our Savior found us worthy enough to share in our human nature with us. This is the point of Gaudete Sunday, this time of joy which the Church gives us on this Third Sunday of Advent. It is a time when we can see the "finish line" of Advent and can start to think about Christmas Day and the Christmas Season (which lasts until the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord on January 12, 2025).

May we come to know the joy that the Lord has in store for us by recognizing that even in the midst of suffering, alluded to in our first reading from the prophet Zephaniah, there is cause for rejoicing. May we share the joy we feel, the joy which led St. Francis to celebrate Christmas with such fervor, with all whom we meet.


