




# **NOTES FROM THE PASTOR**

My Dear Friends in Christ,

Growing up as the youngest of five in an Irish-Catholic family had it its "ups



and downs", its joys and challenges (and continue to do so into adulthood!). There were times that we were each other's worst enemy, yet there were also times when we were each other's best friend! It was (and sometimes still is) a "love-hate" relationship. I have no doubt that the Holy Family, as iconic as they are with regard to family life, had their challenges. When one looks at today's gospel, one recognizes that while there was perfection within the Holy Family of Mary, Joseph, and the Child Jesus, things were (at times) far from perfect. Our gospel reading shows us, in Jesus being "lost" in the temple (although, truth be told, He was exactly where He was supposed to be), the challenge of family life and the angst that even a family such as the Holy Family goes through in daily living.

The Feast of the Holy Family, as well as today's readings, brings to mind the challenges and the "helps" to living as a Christian family. When one looks at the Holy Family, one might think that "we, as a family, could never reach the status of the Holy Family". This might be a prevailing thought, but it shouldn't stop us from at least *trying* to live like them. Often times, it is in the *trying* that one has the most success. Although the Holy Family did have the "Immaculate Conception" (in Mary) and the "Incarnation" (in Jesus) (as well as a saint (in Joseph)!), their life was far from perfect! Again, one only has to look to the events in the life of the Holy Family to see the "ups and downs" that they faced, ones that would rival any challenges which we, as family, must go through, even in this day and age.

Today's readings give us "blueprints" as to how we are to live as a Holy Family. These "guidelines" are relevant to us who are connected by baptism, as well as by blood. We can look at the different "roles" that we have in the Church and equate them to life in a family. I often refer to us as a "family of faith", and those familial bonds are ones which are forged through the "ups and downs" through which every family goes. The challenge is to overcome those hurdles through the God-given gifts of faith, hope and love. May we strive to live as the Holy Family. May we continue to look to one another for support and strength. May we know that the Holy Family is there to either intercede (in the case of Mary and Joseph) or act directly (in the case of Jesus) on our behalf. May this Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph be for us a sign, symbol and reality of God's love for us, our Church and the world.



January 26<sup>th</sup> at 1 pm, St. Ann Parish Center



# HOLY FAMILY





### MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY



Today the Church celebrates the Feast of the Holy Family. We are called to look to Mary, Joseph, and (the Child) Jesus as the model and exemplar for family life. When one looks at the life of St. Francis of Assisi, it is a "mixed bag" of both holy and secular living. Francis was born on September 26, 1181

in Assisi to Pietro di Bernardone dei Moriconi, a very wealthy cloth merchant, and his wife Giovanna also known as Pica Bourlemont, about whom little is known except she is said to have belonged to a noble family of Provence, France. He was one of seven children.

Pietro was in France on business when Francis was born, and Pica had him baptized as Giovanni di Bernardone to honor San Giovanni Battista (Saint John the Baptist), in the hope he would grow to be a great religious leader. She even staged the birth of her son in a stable built for the occasion on the ground floor of their home to honor the birth of Jesus. Later the stable will be known as "stalletta" or "Chapel of baby Saint Francis" and it is located in the main square of Assisi. When Pietro returned to Assisi, he decided to add Francesco (Francis) to his son's first name. This name was the medieval equivalent of francese, i.e. "French" and was chosen to honor France, his favored business destination and to honor the child's maternal heritage.

Pietro's worldly success and the imperial privileges granted by the city governor Duke Corrado di Lützen had secured for the young Francis a care-free life of material comfort. He received his education at the catholic school of San Giorgio, spoke fluent Latin and Provençal and was considered by his father the natural heir of his family business. Francis was short and skinny, and had dark hair. He was a popular youth, often the center of attention that could be found engaged in sport, frequenting the piazze of the city and leisurely spending his father's money. His nickname was "rex iuvenum" (king of banquets).

After the death of the German Emperor Enrico IV (1165-1197) and the election of a new pope, Cardinal Lotario di Segni, later known as Pope Innocent III (1198-1216), the political landscape changed and the pope took under his control additional territories which also included Spoleto and Assisi. The people of these towns revolted against the nobles who took refuge in the nearby town of Perugia. Francis who had dreams of being a knight took part in this war and when the Assisians were defeated in Ponte San Giovanni, he became a prisoner of Perugia and spent one year in prison. His family was able to get him out after paying a substantial ransom but his health had already been compromised.

This started a spiritual crisis where he abandoned his former life to embrace meditation, nursing lepers and begging for the poor. His father Pietro attempted to bring him to his senses, first with threats and then with corporal punishment. After a final interview in the presence of the bishop Guido II, Francis renounced his father and his wealth, laying aside even the garments he had received from him while the bishop covered him with his mantle. He lived as a beggar around Assisi. Returning to the town, he restored several ruined churches, among them San Damiano, San Pietro alla Spira, and the Porziuncola in Santa Maria degli Angeli, just outside the town, which later became his favorite refuge. On this feast of the Holy Family, let us strive to live like Francis, not seeing the world as a place to conquer, but as a place to offer God's love to all peoples. Let us go into this new year with a heart like Francis, striving to see Jesus in all and be Jesus for all.


